This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorised by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by His Majesty, for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An Act for punishing mutiny and desertion, and for the better payment of the army and their quarters.

An Act for the regulation of His Majesty's royal marine forces while on shore.

An Act for taking down the parish church of Stretton-upon-Dunsmore, in the county of Warwick

and diocese of Lichfield and Coventry, and building a new church in lieu thereof.

An Act for the better sewage, cleansing, and draining of the town of Cheltenham, in the county of Gloucester.

An Act for more effectually repairing and improving the road from Bolton to Kearsley, called the Moses Gate District of Road, and a branch thereof from Stone Clough to Pilkington, all in the county of Lancaster.

An Act to rectify a mistake in an Act of the last session of Parliament, for more effectually repairing and improving certain roads leading to and through the town of Goudhurst, in the county of Kent.

An Act for repairing the road from Bicester, in the county of Oxford, to Aylesbury, in the county of Buckingham.

An Act for more effectually repairing and improving the several roads comprising the Flint, Holywell, and Mostyn districts of roads, in the county of Flint, and for making new deviations and extensions of roads to communicate with the said districts.
