This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorised by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by His Majesty, for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear, the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An Act to amend two Acts, for more effectually draining and preserving certain marsh lands or low grounds, in the counties of Kent and Sussex, draining into the River Rother and Channel of Appledore.

An Act for making the hamlets of Newbold and Armscott a separate parish from the parish of Tredington, in the county and diocese of Worcester; and for building a church and providing a church-yard and parsonage-house at Newbold.

An Act for better supplying with water the city and county of the city of Exeter, and such part of the parish of St. David as is situated in the county of Devon.

An Act for more effectually supplying with water the city and county of the city of Exeter and places adjacent thereto.

An Act to alter and amend an Act, of the fifty-third year of His late Majesty King George the Third, for better assessing and collecting the poor and other rates in the parish of St. Giles, Camberwell, in the county of Surrey, and regulating the affairs thereof; and for other purposes relating thereto.
