This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, authorised by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by His Majesty, for declaring His Rayal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate uttendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act to repeal the duties on personal estates, continued by an Act of the present session of Parliament.

An Act to reduce the duty payable on cotton wool imported into the United Kingdom.

An Act for repealing the duties and drawbacks of Excise on tiles.

An Act to provide for the execution of the duties performed by the Barons of Exchequer in Scotland in relation to the public revenue, and to place the management of the assessed taxes and land tax in Scotland under the Commissioners for the Affairs of Taxes.
