THE following Address of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland having been transmitted by Robert Montgomery Lord Belhaven, His Majesty's Commissioner, to Viscount Melbourne, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, has been by him presented to the King; which Address His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously:

May it please your Majesty,

THE gracious letter with which your Majesty has honoured this meeting of the General Assembly of our National Church, has been received by us with deep respect and gratitude.

It yields us the highest satisfaction to be assured of the deep interest which your Majesty feels in the well-being of the Church of Scotland; and of your Majesty's sense of the benefits which have been derived to the interests of religion from the counsels of former General Assemblies. It shall be our earnest endeavour to merit a continuance of the approbation thus graciously expressed.

The re-appointment of a Commissioner, so well qualified as Lord Belhaven, to represent your Majesty's person in our Assembly, we regard as a new proof of royal favour; his faithful discharge of the duties entrusted to him in former Assemblies eminently entitles him to our respect and attachment.

We entreat your Majesty to accept of our most respectful and cordial acknowledgment of the assurance so graciously given of your Majesty's fixed purpose to continue to the Church of Scotland the same support and protection which it has received from your Royal Ancestors; and to maintain it in the full enjoyment of all its rights and privileges as by law established. Profiting by your Majesty's paternal counsel, we shall in all our proceedings endeavour to the utmost of our power to consult the happiness and best interests of our people; and it is

our earnest prayer that our measures may be directed, under the blessing of God, to promote pure religion, peace, and universal charity.

We receive with thankfulness, and shall endeavour to employ with fidelity, the royal donation of two thousand pounds for the propagation of Christian knowledge in the Highlands and Islands of Scotland.

That Almighty God, the Father of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, may bless your Majesty, your Royal Consort, and all the Members of your Royal House; that He may guide your Majesty's counsels and prosper your administration; and that, after a long and happy reign on earth, you may inherit a kingdom which cannot be moved, are the prayers of, may it please your Majesty, your Majesty's most faithful, most obedient, and most loyal subjects, the Ministers and Elders met in this National Assembly of the Church of Scotland.

This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorised by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by His Majesty, for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read;* and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act for better regulating the market, and cleansing the streets and preventing nuisances in the town of Taunton, in the county of Somerset; and for amending two several Acts, of His late Majesty King George the Third, relative thereto.

An Act to alter and enlarge the powers of several Acts, passed for the better relief and employment of the poor in the hundred of Wangford, in the county of Suffolk.

An Act to alter, amend, and enlarge the powers of an Act, passed in the fourth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for the better relief and employment of the poor in the hundred of Mutford and Lothingland, in the county of Suffolk.

An Act for building a bridge over the River Trent, from Walton-upon-Trent, in the county of Derby, to Barton-under-Needwood, in the county of Stafford.

An Act for paving, cleansing, lighting, watching, and improving the town and parishes of Gravesend,

and Milton, in the county of Kent, and for removing and preventing nuisances and annoyances therein.

An Act for making a railway from London to Greenwich.

An Act to alter, amend, and enlarge the powers of an Act, passed in the ninth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, for making and maintaining a railway or tramroad, from Gelly Gille Farn, in the parish of Llanelly, in the county of Carmarthen, to Machynis Pool, in the same parish and county; and for making and maintaining a wet dock, at the termination of the said railway or tramroad, at Machynis Pool aforesaid.

An Act for repairing and maintaining the road from Stone-street Hatch, at Ockley, in the county of Surrey, to Warnham, in the county of Sussex.

An Act for more effectually repairing the road from Tunstall, in the county of Stafford, to Bosley, in the county of Chester, and from Great Chell to Shelton, in the said county of Stafford, and for making a new line and diversion of road to communicate therewith.

An Act for more effectually repairing the roads leading from the city of Gloucester towards the city of Hereford, and also towards Newent and Newnam, in the county of Gloucester, Ledbury, in the county of Hereford, and Upton-upon-Severn, in the county of Worcester.

An Act for more effectually repairing the road from the north end of the road called the Coal Road, near West Auckland, in the county of Durham, to the Elsdon Road, near Elishaw, in the county of Northumberland.

An Act to amend an Act, passed in the seventh year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, for repairing the roads from Manchester to Salter's-brook, and for making several roads to communicate therewith; and also for making a certain new extension or diversion of the said roads, instead of a certain extension or diversion by the said Act authorised to be made.

An Act for more effectually repairing the several roads leading from the borough of Ledbury, in the county of Hereford, and the road from the parish of Broomesberrow to the road from Gloucester to Worcester, and for making several roads to communicate therewith.

An Act for more effectually repairing the road from the Canal-bridge, in Hurdfield, in the county of Chester, to the turnpike road at Randle Carrlane Head, in Fernilee, in the county of Derby, leading to Chapel in the Frith, in the same county.

Whereas the Select Committee appointed to try and determine the merits of the petition of Robert MacGregor and others, electors, complaining of an undue election and return for the borough of Carnarvon, have this day reported to the House of Commons, "That it appeared to the Committee that the merits of the petition did depend, in part, upon the right of election; and that, therefore, the said Committee required the Counsel for the petitioners, and the Counsel for the sitting Member, to deliver to the Clerk of the said Committee statements, in writing, of the right of election for which they

respectively contended:—that in consequence thereof, the Counsel for the petitioners delivered in a statement as follows:—that the ancient and reserved right of voting in the election of a Member to serve in Parliament for the town and borough of Carnarvon, in the county of Carnarvon, not including Bangor, but so far as relates to the town and borough of Carnarvon, and to the several towns, boroughs, or places of Pwllheli, Conway, Nefin, and Criccieth, respectively sharing in the election with Carnarvon, is in the inhabitants of those respective places paying scot and lot:—that the Counsel for the sitting Member delivered in a statement as follows:—that the right of voting for Members to serve in Parliament for the borough of Carnarvon, and the several contributory boroughs, before the passing of the Statute 2d and 3d Will. 4, c. 45, was in the burgesses of the respective corporations, duly admitted and sworn:—that upon the statement delivered in by the Counsel for the petitioners, the said Committee have determined, that the right of election, as set forth in the said statement, is the right of election for the said borough:—that upon the statement delivered in by the Counsel for the sitting Member, the said Committee have determined, that the right of election, as set forth in the said statement, is not the right of election for the said borough:—

I do hereby give this notice, in pursuance of the directions of an Act, passed in the ninth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act to consolidate and amend the laws relating to the trial of controverted elections or returns of Members to serve in Parliament."
