House, St. James's, June 5, 1833.*

**N**OTICE is hereby given, that the Queen will hold her last Drawing-Room for this season, on Thursday the 20th instant.

No Lady can be presented to the Queen at Her Majesty's Drawing-Rooms, unless the Lady who presents be actually present at the Drawing-Room.

**T**O prevent mistakes and misconceptions, His Majesty has been pleased to order, that at the Queen's Drawing-Rooms and Her Majesty's State Balls, the Masters of the Horse, the Master of the Buck Hounds, Equerries and Pages of Honour, and all Officers of the Navy and Army, Militia and Yeomanry, the Lords Lieutenants of Counties and Deputy Lieutenants, should appear in uniform pantaloons and boots, agreeably to regulation.

All persons belonging to their Majesties' Households, and all others who wear the civil uniform, are, on similar occasions, to appear in shoes with buckles, and breeches with knee buckles.

**T**HIS day the Right Honourable Edward John Littleton was, by His Majesty's command, sworn of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and took his place at the Board accordingly.

To which audiences they were respectively introduced by Lord Viscount Palmerston, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and conducted by Sir Robert Chester, Knt. Master of the Ceremonies.

**CEREMONIAL** of the Investiture of Vice-Admiral Sir John Harvey and Vice-Admiral Sir George Parker, with the Ensigns of Knights Commanders of the Most Honourable Military Order of the Bath.

By command of the Sovereign, Vice-Admiral Sir John Harvey was conducted, with the usual reverences, to His Majesty, preceded by Sir William Woods (the Officer of Arms attendant upon the Knights Commanders), bearing upon a crimson velvet cushion, the star, ribband, and badge of the second class of the Order.

The sword of state being thereupon delivered to His Majesty, the Vice-Admiral, kneeling, was knighted therewith, after which he had the honour to kiss His Majesty's hand. Then the Officer of Arms, on his knee, presenting to the Sovereign the
