## Gerour, February t.

OUR Letters from Rome tell us, that the Senator Lando, Envoy from the Republick of Vemice, had had feve ral Audiences of the Pope on the Subject of the League which is :ow treacing with that State ggainft the Turks. The laft week died the Cardinal Archbifhop of Bologue, by whofe death there are 21 places vacant in the Colledge of Cardinals.

Prenice, February 12. On Sunday arrived here the Dake of mantux, who, weare told, intends to pals fom: time in this City. On Saturday the Imperial and Spanifh Ambalfadors refiding here, had Audience of the Senate, the firf having the day berore received an Exprefs from Lintz. By a Bank arriv.d from $R$ agufa, we have the Confi mation of the Grand Vifies having been flrangled at Belgrade, and the Malter of the faid Bark adds, It was reported that the Grand Signior, upon the News he had of the great Succeffes of the Coflacks, and the Revolt of the Moldavians and Walachians, was gone in great hafte from Adrianople, not thinking him cif Secure there. The Morlaques continue their Depredations upon the Torks, and their number en. creafes daily. In Albaniz the People are faid to tape tikewife teket Arms; and we have atvice from feveral Parts of Tuxkey, that there are not only great Difcontents among the People, but likewife among the Suldiers, and appearances of great commotions
Stockbolme, Fanyary r6. The King of Sweden parted from lience the 4 th inflant, and is now at che Copper Mines; His Majefties chiefd.fign in this Journey, is to take a review of his Troops quarreed in thofe Parts, and to appoint the manner of their Subfiftence. The Ryx Drofl Count de fa Garde lyes fo very ill, that his recovery is almi it delpaired of. Baron Horne is anrived here from $\operatorname{Bremen}$, to give the King an account of the pofture of Aftairs on that fide. The Seafon is here rery rigorous,

Gracem, Frbruary 3. We hat a report here the Jaft Weck, that the Coffacks hat been angaged with a Body of Turk ai:d lartars, whith was by much too flrong for them, and bad been forced to retire with the lofs of berween 2 and zosd men; but fince we have receiycd a particular account of that Action, which thereby appears to havebeen quite other wile, and that the Coflacks haver fecond time obtained a very great Victory over the Turks and Taptars commanded by the new Holpodar Dukes, who was going to take Poffeffion of the Government of Walacbia, which the Graid Signior had conferred upon him, having depoled the Holpodar Petrozousko prefently after the raifing the Siege of Fieman ypon the Complaincs made againft him by che Grand Vifiet. This Body of Turks and Tartar", having advice that the Coflacks plundered and deffroyed the Country of paffarabia, paffed the Danube not far from the place $u$ hare it divides it felfintes feveral Branches which fall iato the Black Sea, ard fell upen them; the Coffaks wete fur-
prized, bat putting themelves into the beff pon flure they could, they received the Enemy very well On the other fide the Tutks and Tartars preffed hard uponthem, and the Colfacks Horfe nat being able to maintain their groudd, retreated with their General Kuniski; the Foor fielng themrelves thus abandoned, became defperara, and reiolving to dye or Conquer, they not only defended themfeties, but had their turn to attack the Enemy who feeing their obftinacy, b gan to gite groant, whicti tlicy dis with fo much Conurage and Bravery, that ${ }^{\prime}$ they nbtained a very gr:at Victory, abrove ysooo -f the Enemy being laain, and the Hofpodar puto taken Prifoner. After the Fight, the Colfacks bcing very much diffacisfied with $K$ unisk $i$ for haring forlaken th $=\mathrm{m}$, chofe an Eminent Officer among them, whofe name is Mohila to be their General which, it's not doubted but the King of Poland will approve of, not to give them any occafith of diffas tisfaction, while they render his Majefly furti fignal Services as they now do. The Conte: quence of this vietory hath been the re-effabliftment of Petrozensko in walachis, and Diemeniski in Moidavil, and the fixiug thereby thoft Countrits H a dependence upon this Crown. Our Letters from Mofcovy give us great reafon 10 be lieve that the Czars wittenter into tre War againft the Tarks. The News of the Grand Vifitrs being frangled at' Belgrade, is confirmed; ant iu's faid the Caimacan is declared his Sueceffor.

Lintz, February 12. The 7oth Tuffant artived here an Extraordinary Courier from Cracow. With an account of $a$ fecond Victory obrained by the Colfacks againft the Turks and Tartars. The Par ticulars are there. The new Palatipe or Hofpodar' of Walackis Duker, marching with 30000 men to difplace Petrozensko whom the King of Poland had res eftablifh'd in that Government, atid having an drcoont that the Coffacks were in fo carelefs a pofture that they might be fallen upon with great adrantage, he alvanced with all the diligenke be could towards then. Kuniski General of the Coffacks having got knowledge of his. defign, would have reo treated with the whole Army, which he faid wat tired out and not able to refift fo great a Force as the Enemy then had, but the major part oppored him. However Kuniki retired with 4050 of his beft men, thereft, fwearing together, that they would either conquet or dye, pofted themkelveds as advantageoully as they could, and cxpededthe2Enemy, whom thes received with fo much Vigot did Refolucion, that they foon retreated, and the Coffacks thereupon attacking cherid with grcater fury, ther ficd, the H 6 (podar Dukas, his Soph, and the Baffia who tommanded the Turks, being mate Prifoners, two Pieces of Canton takeri, and ty000 (fome fay apoob) of the Turks atid Tartars thain upoti the place; the Coffacks after the Fightr. fend to jequaint Refhthei with the Viatbry they had obrainsd, and defired bim to joyn them again, bot be'rufuing, they intion mediately chofe one Mobila 'to be their General. This aews hath Beer reccived here'wlth a great Aeal of joy; and the Emperor hath aptrofinted Tc Dewn to be fang, and the Cannon to beditcharged tound this placs.
