We are told that the molt Chriftian King hath granted the Elc Etor of Trier a Neutrality: That the Bifiop of Paderborne is come into the Alliance conchused fome time fince becweentre King of \#enmark and the Eleciors of Ciologno ant Brandenburg rand the late Bifhop of Manfter, at Souft: And that the Efetor of Coldgne is geing to fornra Camp of 6000 men near Rhinberg.

Hague, March7. The States of Holland were at fembled from drednefday till לaturday laft, when they feparated for three on fur days: The City of Amjterdam continues to demand the rettitution of their l'apersz ayd Securioy for their Deputies, and tilt chey have fatisfaetion chereim, will nor, It's faid, fend any Deputies tur the Alfembly. The States-Gente al have refolved to fend a Deputation to Friaeland; to induce that province taconfent to the new Leyy, though we are told that thofs States have writtĕn to the StaresGeneral, to defire they will not give themSelves that erouble, for that they (the States of Fyipelasd) cannot depart from the Refolution which they have taken after moft ferious and ma sure deliberation in this matter. The sieur Peffers is fent for Zealand, to perfuade the Magiftrates of Middleburg to confent to the faid Levy. The Deputies of the Statç had on Thurfday lafta long Conference with the Minitters of the Allics. The Ftench Ambaffador has given in a Memorial to the SratesGencral, wherein be compldius, That fome Goods belonging to the Subjects of France have beentaken out of a Dutch Ship by a Privatece of oftend, and defires the States will give fuch Orders that the like may not bappen for the Future, for that otherwife the French Frigats will lay their hands upon all the Spanilh Effects they fhall find on Board the Merchanc Ships of thefe Countreys.

Paris, March 4. The Mareichal de Belfonds parted from hence yefterday for Bayomne, near which place is appointed the Rendezvous of the Troops that are to act under his Commated on the fide of Navarre. The king has given bim for LieutecantGenerals Monfieur de Cbaferon, Moulieur Caluo, and Monfeur Reuel, and for Marefchals de Camp, Monfeur la Molte d'Anguien, Monfieur da Saucé, and Monficur Mfontaigu. The Marquis de Hoquincourt, and the Marquis de Hantefort have Commiffious cu raife two kegiments of Foot, and we are told tiat feveral others mill be given out very luddenly. The Guardsdu Corps and other Troops of the Kings Houtholfi march towards Flander's; And agieat many Horks are bought up for the Service of the Artillery. The Marefchal de Creqni is exp Eted at Cotrte in fuw days, but will as is faid, - make no long lay there. We are told, that the Duke of Saroy sill fend a Procuration to the Duke of Cbaytres to Marry Madamoifille in his name, and that the Solemnity thereof will be performed the isth Inflant. From Tlioulon we have advice, That the Ghevalier de Tourville put to Sea from thence the isth of the lalt Month, wish the Ships under his Gommand.
