THIS day the Right Honourable Sir James Parke, Knt. one of the Judges of His Majesty's Court of King's Bench, was, by His Majesty's command, sworn of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and took his place at the Board accordingly.

AT the Court at *St. James's*, the 4th day of *September* 1833,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THIS day the Right Honourable Sir John Bernard Bosanquet, Knt. one of the Judges of His Majesty's Court of Common Pleas, and the Right Honourable Sir Alexander Johnston, Knt. were, by His Majesty's command, sworn of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and took their respective places at the Board accordingly.

Acts received the Royal Assent, August 29, 1833.

(The King Present.)

An Act to apply the sum of six millions out of the Consolidated Fund to the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three, and to appropriate the supplies granted in this session of Parliament.

An Act for giving to the Corporation of the Governor and Company of the Bank of England certain privileges, for a limited period, under certain conditions.

An Act for the relief of the owners of tithes in Ireland, and for the amendment of an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to amend three Acts, passed respectively in the fourth, fifth, and in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, providing for the establishing of compositions for tithes in Ireland, and to make such compositions permanent."

An Act for facilitating the appointment of sheriffs, and the more effectual audit and passing of their accounts, and for the more speedy return and recovery of fines, issues, forfeited recognizances, penalties, and deodands, and to abolish certain offices in the Court of Exchequer.

An Act to prevent the selling and uttering of forged stamps, and to exempt from stamp duty artificial mineral waters in Great Britain, and to allow a drawback on the exportation of gold and silver plate manufactured in Ireland.

An Act to provide for the collection and management of the duties on tea.

An Act to regulate the labour of children and young persons in the mills and factories of the United Kingdom.

An Act to repeal certain penal enactments, made in the Parliament of Ireland, against Roman Catholic clergymen for celebrating marriages contrary to the

provisions of certain Acts made in the Parliament of Ireland.

An Act to render freehold and copyhold estates assets for the payment of simple and contract debts.

An Act for the amendment of the law relating to dower.

An Act for the amendment of the law of inheritance.

An Act to appoint Trustees for the Creditors of the City of Edinburgh.

Whitehall, September 4, 1833.

The King has been pleased to nominate and appoint the Right Honourable Charles Manners Sutton, Speaker of the House of Commons, to be a Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath.

At the Court at St. James's, September 4, 1833.

CEREMONIAL of the Investiture of the Right Honourable Sir Charles Manners Sutton, Speaker of the House of Commons, with the Ensigns of a Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath.

The following Knights Grand Crosses, in their mantles and collars of the Order, assembled at St. James's-Palace, viz. Sir John Doyle, Bart.; Sir William Henry Clinton; the Right Honourable Sir James Kempt; Sir George Townsend Walker; Sir Thomas Hislop, Bart.; the Earl of Rosslyn; Sir Thomas Byam Martin; Sir James Willoughby Gordon, Bart.; and the Lord Viscount Palmerston; attended by Algernon Greville, Esq. Bath King of Arms; and Sir William Woods, Clarenceux King of Arms, Deputy Register and Secretary of the Order.

At two o'clock the Knights Grand Crosses were called over, and, with the Officers of the Order, proceeded into the presence of the Sovereign in the Throne-room, with the accustomed reverences.

Then, by His Majesty's command, the Right Honourable Charles Manners Sutton, the Speaker of the House of Commons, was introduced into the Royal Presence, between Sir James Willoughby Gordon, Bart. and the Lord Viscount Palmerston, the two Junior Knights Grand Crosses present, preceded by Bath King of Arms, bearing the ribband, badge, and star of a Knight Grand Cross upon a crimson velvet cushion, and by Sir William Woods, Clarenceux, acting for the Gentleman Usher of the Order.

The sword of state being thereupon delivered by Sir John Doyle, Bart. the Senior Knight Grand Cross present, to the Sovereign, the Right Honourable the Speaker, kneeling, was knighted therewith; after which he had the honour to kiss the Sovereign's hand.

Sir John Doyle having then received from Bath King of Arms the ribband and badge, presented them to the Sovereign, and His Majesty was gra-

ciously pleased to put the same over the Speaker's right shoulder.

Sir Charles Manners Sutton, rising, had again the honour to kiss the Sovereign's hand, and, having received from His Majesty the star of the Order, retired.

The Knights Grand Crosses were then again called over, and, with the Officers of the Order, retired from the presence of the Sovereign, with the usual reverences.
