HEREAS it hath been humbly represented unto the King, that Joseph Cash, a publican, of Newtown, a township adjoining Hyde, near Manchester, returning home from Mottram on horseback, between twelve and one o'clock on the night of the 21st ultimo, about a mile from his own house, was pulled from his horse, treated brutally, and robbed, and died a few days after of the injuries he received;

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the person or persons concerned in the murder before mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious pardon to any one of them (except the person who actually committed the same) who shall discover his accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And, as a further encouragement, a reward of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS is hereby offered by the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, to any person (except as aforesaid) who shall discover the said offender or offenders, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted of the said offence.
