## BILL, NOTE, AND RECEIPT STAMPS, CHANGE OF DIES.

Stamps and Taxes, October 11, 1833.

THE Commissioners of Stamps do hereby give THE Commissioners of Stamps do hereby give notice, in pursuance of an Act of the last session of Parliament (3 and 4 W. 4th, cap. 97.) that they have determined to discontinue the use of all and every the dies at any time heretofore provided and used for denoting or marking the stamp duties now by law payable for, or in respect of the several matters and things following, (that is to say), Bills of Exchange, Promissory Notes, and Receipts given for or upon the payment of money; and that they have provided new dies to be used for denoting or marking the duties aforesaid in lieu of the said dies whereof the use is intended to be discontinued.

And the said Commissioners do also hereby fix and appoint the 30th day of November next ensuing as the last day for engrossing, writing, or printing any of the several matters or things aforesaid upon vellum, parchment, or paper stamped or marked with any of the said dies whereof the use is intended to be discontinued; and they do also direct and declare that from and after the said 30th day of November

the said new dies, so provided as aforesaid, shall be the only true and lawful dies for denoting the duty charged or chargeable upon, or in respect of, the several matters and things aforesaid, to which the same are respectively applicable.

The new dies are respectively appropriated to Bills of Exchange, Promissory Notes, and Receipts, by having the words "Bill or Note," or the word "Receipt," on the face thereof, and the impressions of all such new dies may be distinguished from the impressions of any dies heretofore provided and used by having also on the face thereof certain figures, intended to denote the date of such impressions respectively.

All persons who have in their possession any Stamps for Bills of Exchange, Promissory Notes, or Receipts which may be rendered useless by reason of the providing of the said new dies will be entitled to have impressions of the said new dies in lieu of and to an equal amount with such useless stamps on the latter being presented at the Head Office for Stamps, in Westminster or Edinburgh, at any time within three calendar months next after the said 30th day of November.
