Extracts of Dispatches from Thomas Cartwright, Esq. His Majesty's Minister Plenipotentiary to the Germanic Confederation, to Viscount Palmerston, dated Hanover, November 27, 1833.

I HAVE the honour to inform your Lordship, that Her Royal Highness the Duchess of Cambridge was this morning safely delivered of a Princess.

Her Royal Highness and the Infant are considered to be doing as well as can possibly be expected.

In addition to the Gentlemen whom His Royal Highness the Duke of Cambridge was pleased to appoint to act with me upon this occasion, the following persons were in attendance, viz.—Dr. Kaufmann, Physician and Accoucheur to the Court; Dr. Stieglitz, Physician to the Court; Mrs. Radecker, Nurse; Mrs. Page, Attendant upon Princess Augusta of Cambridge; Miss Alsfeldt and Miss Loyd, Dressers to Her Royal Highness the Duchess of Cambridge; Miss Queiser, Wardrobe-Maid; and Miss Haumann, Dresser to Her Royal Highness the Grand Duchess of Mecklenburg-Strelitz.
