## Nuplesं, Eebruary 20..

THe Heads of fevetal Banditi have been lately brought hither, fone have been taken alive, and others have accepted of the Pardon promifed them by our Vice-Roy, upon condition they go and ferve in the Emperor's Army againft the Tusks, fo that the number of them is very much leffened, and we hope through the great care that is taken, they will in a fhore time be cotally fuppreffed.
Venice, Marcb 3. Great preparations are making bere for the War againft the Turks; and we are affured that this Republick will have a very confiderable Flcet at Sea before the beginning of May; The Senate have made choice of molt of the Primeipal Officers, and the reft will be named in few days. And belides this Naval Force it's faid the State will have an Army in Dalmalis; The Prince of Parmi Generd of their Foot raif, 3000 men, and other Levies are making. Our laft Letters from Rome gave an acconnt that the Pope had been very much indifpofed, but that he was pretty well again; That his Holinefs had lately fent the King of Poland 200000 Crowns, and intended to lend him very fuddenly a farther fupply: From Turkey they write, that the Tundowith-bing agreatnmbers of men into the Field this next Summer; And from Smirse we are told, that they haye fope all the Merchant Ships that are there, intending to make ufe of them to carry over their Troops from Afia.

Duatiack, March s. W/s have Letters from Rigin of the 23 . palt, which tell us, that though the Minilters of the Court at Mojcow íeem very defirous in confideration of the prefent pate of their affaits at home, to be in pare with their Neighbours, yet the advantages which they may propore to themfelves by turning their Arms in fo tavorabic a Coujuncture as this againft the Jurks, who are pofieffed of feveral places, belonging heretofore to the Molcovites, on the fide of the $\quad \mathrm{lkraiz}$, it uas not doubted wild prevall with them to embrace the Overtures thatare now made them of an Alliance with the Emperor and the King of Poland Our laft Letters from Cracow told us, that the King was wholly taken up with direding the Preparations for the approaching Campagne ; and that bis Majelty would be verv early in the Field.

Viewns, Maret 5. They write from Humgary, that the Turks having again preparet a great Convoy for Newbeufel, had brought it as far as Waitzen, but underitanding that the Imperialifts had lecured all the paflages about Nerobeufel, durft venture no farther. In the mean cime that Garifon is faid to be in great want of Provifions, a and if fome fpeedy care be not taken to relieve them, they will be forced to furrender the place upon the befl Terms they can obtain. That the Turks make great preparations for the next Campagne is confirmed from all parts, and if we may believe the advices that come from fome private hands, the Grand Signior will bend his greateft force towards Hungary, and will endeavor to bring the Chrillians to a Battle. The Commiffion of Presbourg will in all likelihood have a very good
effect; feveral of the Hingarians that were the latt Campagne in Arms againft the Emperor having laid hold of the General Pardon; and others that for fear-of Count Teckeley, to whom they and their Eftates lie at prefent expofed, date not now appear at Presbourg; have it's faid given private affurances of their tuture Fidelity to the Emperor: The faft account we had of Count Teckeley, was, that he had repaffed the Tibifque; and that he had indeed fummoned the Nobility of Upper Hungdry to meet at Ejperies, to hold a Dyet there, but that the march of the Troops of Litbuania, who we are affured have orders to attack that place as well as Cafchaid, had made him puit off that meeting to Come more convenient time. A great many men are daily at work on the Fortifications of this City.

Liatz, March 7. On the 2gth palt the League againft the Turks was Signed by the Cardinal Bonvif on the part of the Pope; by the Count de Coningfecke and the Baron Strdetman for the Empervir; and of the behalf of the King and Crowis of Poland and the Republick of Fextre, by their respeclive Ambalfadors; and the fame day Expretfes were difpatched from hence for Cracozv and Venite with the news thereof. An Officer, who arrived h-re two days agone froin Nenofol in fiumbary, told as that-feverad-Ewhilh-pritume's pfitat en byought thither, and that they underftood from them as well as by uthet ways, that the Vifice of Buda had affured the Baffor of Notiberfel that he woild very [peedily relieve him, that for that purpor: he was prepari,ug a grear Convoy, and char in the mean time be had font him Jome Moneys. The Duke o. Lorrain is expected back from Prespourg about the middle of this Month, and it's not doubted Gut he will give the Emperar a vety groud account of that Commifion And fo fopn as jisis Highners recur, s, its fald a day will be apponited for the Rendezvous of the Imperial Army. If is not yet known whether the king of Boland wilt-att this next Campagne with his main Army in Eodolia or Hungary, that dependigg upon the nrotigns of the Enemy. It is reported that the Elector of saxony has promifed toanfff the Emperor with his forces this Campagne; but it's crrtain that the Elector of Brandenburg and the Elector' of Cologne have offered to alift the Emperor with 1:000 men cach, and that fome other Princes of the Empire have likewife offered confforabie member of Troops for ehe sesvice of this Wrax, in cale a Peace or Trace be eftablifhed between the Empire and the Crown of France.

Copenbagen, March 6at Tha King of Denmark will it's faid take a journey for Holfointhe beginning of the next Month. The Levies that are making for his Service advance with good fuccefs; and we areaffured his Maj:fty will hate an Army of 30000 men in the Field, and a pery good Elect at Sea.

Francfort, March g. Our haf ldetis's from Ratifbonne gave us an account that a new Difficulty was arifen about the Titls of Excellency, which the Count de Winditgratz the Emperor's Commifioner precenids to. And that the Count de Crecy the French Btenigotentiary had given in apothermemo-
rtat to the Dyer concerning a General Truce. From Munickthey write that theeteettor of Bavaria will bave this.ncxt Cempogne an Army of 28000 men, and that with thefe wall jath thy Troops bf the Circtes of Bavartianad Eidnconita.
