And all Mayors, Justices, Coroners, and other Officers, before whom any inquisitions, informations, examinations, or recognizances may have been taken touching any such offences, are required to transmit the same forthwith to Mr. John Clark, the Clerk of Arraignment of the High Court of Admiralty of England, at his Office, at the Sessions-house, in the Old Bailey, London.

THE Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, do hereby give notice, that on Thursday the 13th of February next, at one o'clock, they will be ready to treat with such persons as may be willing to contract for supplying and delivering the following articles into His Majesty's Victualling Stores at Deptford, viz.

Wheat (Red), 2000 Quarters; Wheat (White), 500 Quarters; half of each to be delivered by the 1st of March, and the remainder by the 22d of March next.
