REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING-ROOMS.

The Ladies who propose to attend the Queen's Drawing-Rooms are requested to bring with them two cards with their names thereon written, one to be left with the Queen's Page in attendance in the Presence-Chamber, and the other to be delivered to the Queen's Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the names to Her Majesty. And those Ladies who are to be presented are hereby informed, that it is absolutely necessary that their names, with the name of the Lady who is to present them, should be sent in to the Office of the Lord Chamberlain to the Queen, three days before the Drawing-Room at which they are to be presented takes place, in order that they may be submitted for the Queen's approbation, it being Her

Majesty's command, that no presentations at the Drawing-Room shall be made through the Lord Chamberlain, unless the name of the Lady presenting, with that of the Lady to be presented, shall appear on the card to be delivered, as before directed, corresponding with the names sent in to the Office of the Lord Chamberlain to the Queen.

No Lady can be received by Her Majesty but in conformity with the above regulations.

HEREAS by an Order of His Majesty in Council, bearing date the ninth day of December one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three, made in pursuance of an Act of Parliament, passed in the third and fourth year of His Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to regulate the trade to China "and India," certain duties were imposed on British ships and goods on board thereof trading to Canton, and certain regulations thereon were made for the raising and application of the said duties; and whereas it is expedient that the said Order should be revoked, rescinded, annulled, and made void:

Unto the KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

The dutiful and loyal Address of the Lord Provost, Magistrates, and Council of the City of Edinburgh.

May it please your Majesty,

WE, the Lord Provost, Magistrates, and Councillors of the City of Edinburgh, in Council assembled, beg to express our devoted attachment to your Majesty's Person and Government, and to proclaim the ardent gratitude we feel for the many beneficent and wise measures by which your mild and peaceful reign has been distinguished, the liberties of the people extended, their burdens reduced, and their happiness promoted.

We have especially to express our unfeigned gratification on the passing of the great, salutary, and necessary measure of parliamentary reform, and the no less just and necessary measure of relief afforded to the people of Scotland, by the passing of the Municipal Reform Act, which restored to them

their long denied rights and liberties.

Called by the voice of our fellow citizens at a difficult crisis to administer the affairs of this great city, it will be our anxious endeavour, in imitation of the noble example set by your Majesty to Magistrates and all in authority, to redress every local grievance, remove every cause of just discontent, and foster among all classes that cheerful obedience to the laws, and that spirit of mutual forbearance and conciliation which are essential to individual happiness and national prosperity.

As many of the great and important subjects which long occupied the anxious attention of Parliament and the people have now received the sanction of the Legislature, we trust the state of public affairs will soon enable your Majesty and your Royal Consort to visit your ancient kingdom of Scotland; and we can assure your Majesty of a most hearty and joyous welcome from the most faithful of your Majesty's loyal subjects, the Citizens

of Edinburgh.

Deeply sensible of the many great and precious blessings, civil and sacred, we enjoy under the mild and benign sway of your Majesty, we most earnestly hope that the Almighty Disposer of all events will, in mercy to this country and to maukind, grant that your Majesty's life may be long and happy; and that Great Britain, so long the seat of free institutions, science, and literature, and now the secure asylum of every exiled supporter of freedom, will stand forward with renewed energy in the career of improvement, and still preserve its pre-eminence among all nations, great, free, and happy; this is the earnest prayer of, may it please your Majesty, your Majesty's dutiful and loyal subjects, the Lord Provost, Magistrates, and Council of the city of Edinburgh.
