Famaica, Fánhary 10. 7 E have this day received an ac count that Laurens, Michael Tankers, and another Privateer cruifing off of Cartagena. The Spaniards feat out three Men of War, the one mounted

with 40, the other with 34, and the third with as Guns, to chace them off the Coat; who were all three taken by the faid Privateers.

Postferipe. It is certain that Laurens and his Companions have taken two Spanish Men of War, the one of 42; and the other of 38 Guns, and a great Sloop: The Spaniards loft about 400 men, and the Privateers but 14 ; And thele font back the Sloop with the dead and wounded men' to Cartagena. This action happened in Christmas week, three or four Leagues to the Leeward of Cartagena.

Vienna, March 26. Our Letters from Newfol give us an account that the Troops of Lithuania are gene back to Poland, pretending they could no longer subsist in their Quarters in Hungary. That Count Teckeley having received a very confiderable Reinforcement of furks, did ravage and deftroy the Country, and particularly the Effates of fuch of the Nobility as have now again at Presbourg fworn Fidelity to the Emperor; That he was going to attack the Callie of Ungwar; And that it was very much feared he would make himfelf Mailer, of the Berg Towns.

Liniz, March 28. The Duke of Lorrain returned hither, from Presbourg on the 25th inftant, and has fince had feveral Conferences with the Minilters of this Court. Count Teckeley who has got together 10,01 12000 men, spreads a great Terror in Opper-Hungary, and it's said he has again be-slieged Ungmar. The Ratifications of the League against the Turks, to which is added two Private Articles, have been exchanged here, and Ex-prefies were dispatched from hence on Wednesday last with the faid Ratifications to Poland and Venice. The Emperor having received an account that the Troops of Lithuania, and the Polish Troops who had their Quarters in Hungary, have left them and are gone back to Poland, his Imperial Majefly hath fent a Gentleman with Letters to that King, to defire his Majefly to caufe the faid Troops to re-By the way of Gran we have turn to Hungary. advice that the new Grand Vilier is very fuddenly expected at Belgrade, but that it was ftill faid that the Aga of the Jamiaries is to have the chief command of the Army. It is confirmed that the Turks have put lome Companies of Janifaries and 40 Wagons laden with Provisions into Newbeufel.

Hamburg, April 4. The 28 paft fome Danish Troops furprized the Town of Mollem, belonging to the Dake of Jaze-Lawenburg, and others have fince taken quarters in his Country and in Mecklenburg, the King of Denmark having a pretention upon theile Countries, for the quarters which the Emperor affigned his Majefly upon them in the Year 1678. It is faid that the City of Lubecke has treated with the Dukes of Lunenburg for 1000 men, and that they are to pay for them 4000 Crowns a Month. From Copenbagen we have an account, that, the Prince of Mourbacke, Envoy Extraordinary from the Elector of Cologne, was arrived there, and had had a private Andience of the King, and feveral Conferences with his Minillers,

Ratubonne, March 30. Our Letters from Lintz, of the 24th inflant inform Us, that Count Teckelin hath laid in Afhes feveral Villages in the Councy of Scepule, and that the poor Inhabitantshave been forced to take Arms and joyn with hime That be hath with him, befides his own Troops, 4000 Tar cars, 1200 Janifarics, and about stode Jurkille Horie, with which (making together a Body of above 13000 men) he hath again blocked up the Callle of Ungwar!
