Fimaica, チanuary 10. E have this day received an acGount that Laurens, Micbael tinkers. and another Privatecr cruiling oft of Catragent. The Spaniards fent ouc tbrec Men of War, the sne mounted with 40 , the ofther with $3^{2}$, and the third with 25 Guns, fo chace thicm of the Coa: : 'who 'were aill three taken by the Tail Privaters.
Pofffcript. It is cerctain clad Laiurens and his Companions have tak: n two $\$$ panilh Men of War, the one of 42 ; and the other of 36 Guns, and a great Sloop: The Spaniards loff about 400 men, and the Privateers but 44 ; And thefe fent back the Sloop with the dead and wounded min to Cartagena. This action happened in Cbri/lmus weck, three or fourf Leagues to the Leeward of Carragena.
Vienxa, Marcb 26. Our Letters from Nerfol give us an account that the Troops of Litbuania are gone back to poland, pretending they could no longer fubfift in their Quarters in Eiungary. That Count Teckeley having received a very confiderable Reinforcement of rurks, did ravage and deftroy the Country, and particularly the Eltates of Such of the Nobility as have now again at Presbourg fyorn Fidelity to the Emperor; That he was going to attack the Caftte of Ungwar; And. that it was very much feared he would make himfelf Wafteí, of the Berg Towns.

Lintz, March 28. The Duke of Lorrain returyed hither from Presbourg on the 25 th inflant. and bas fruce had feveral Conferences with the Mi nifters of this Court. Count Teckeley who has got together 10, or 12,000 men, , preads a great Terror in $\psi_{\text {pper-fiungary, }}$, apld it's liaid he has again befieged $U_{\text {ngmar. }}$ The Ratifications of the League agaiuft the Turks, to which is added two Private Articles, have been exchanged here, and Exprefles were difparched from hence on Wedneftiay lalt with the Caid Ratifications to Poland and Venice, The Emperor having reccived an account that the Troops of Litbuania, ind the Poliih Troops who had their Quarters in kiungary, have left them and are gone back to Poland, his Imperial Majecty bath fent a Gentleman with Letters to that King, to defire his Majefty fo caufe the fidd Troops to return to Hungary. By the way of Gran we have advice that the new Graud Vifier is viry fiddenly expected at Belgrade, hut that it was litil faid that the Aga of the Jamfaries is to have the chicf command of the Army. It is confirmed that the Turks have put iopme Companies of Janiáaries and 40 Wagons laden with Provifions into Newbeufel.

Hamburg, April 4× The 28 pall fome Danifh Troops furprized the Town of Nollem, belonging to the Dake of Jaxe-Lawenburg, and others have fince taken quarters in his Conntry and in Mecklenburg, the Kinu of Denmark havinga pretentionup. on thęic Colntries, for the quarters which the Empergi daligned. his Maj:fly upon them in the Year sefy8. It is faid that the City of Lubecket has treated with the Dukes of Lumenburg for 1000 mefi, and that they are to pay for them $4^{000}$ Crowns a Monfh. From Copenbrgen we bave ap account, tbat, the Prince of Mourbacke, Envoy Extr ry from the Elector of Cologne, was arrived there, and had had a private Audience of the King gad feyeqal Conferences with his Winiflerg.

Ratikonne, March 3a. Our Letters frank Linttr of the $24^{\text {th }}$ inflant inform us, that Count Teckekity hath laid in Aifhes reveral Villages in whet County of Scepife, and thatethe poor Inhabitanteghava beed foreed to take Arms and joyn with hine That be hath witle him, befides hit owh Trodps, 4 , gome cars, izoo Janifarics, âd X Xabeuthzod Jurkifh Horie, with which (makirg togecher a Booxy of above 13000 ment) ho Hath agzin blooked up the Caftle of Ungwar!
