

St. James's-Palace, August 6, 1834.

This day had audiences of His Majesty, the Prince de Talleyrand, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary from the King of the French, to take leave, *pro tempore*; and the Count St. Martin D'Aglié, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the King of Sardinia, to deliver a letter from his Sovereign:

To which audiences they were respectively introduced by Lord Viscount Palmerston, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and conducted by Sir Robert Chester, Knt. Master of the Ceremonies.

His Majesty has been graciously pleased to nominate and appoint John Samo, Esq. (in the room of John Henry Lance, Esq. retired) to be His Majesty's Commissary Judge to the Mixed British and Netherland Court of Commission, established at Surinam under the Treaty concluded on the 4th of May 1818, between Great Britain and the Netherlands, for the prevention of illegal Slave Trade, and pursuant to the Acts of Parliament which have been passed for carrying that Treaty into effect.
