Irish Salt Meat, equal to 6,500 Navy Tierces of Beef, and 8,500 Navy Tierces of Pork,

in separate tenders, all to be cured in the ensuing season; their Lordships reserving to themselves the

power, when the tenders are opened, of contracting either for the whole or for such part thereof only as they may deem fit, or of not contracting for any part.

The said meat is to be delivered, seven eighth parts thereof in tierces, and the remaining one eighth part thereof in barrells, into His Majesty's Victualling Stores at Deptford, Portsmouth, Plymouth, and Cork, in such proportions as shall hereafter be directed—one half thereof by the 28th day of February, and the other half by the 31st day of May 1835, and to be paid for by bills payable at sight.

ARMY PRIZE-MONEY.

With reference to the foregoing notice, intimation is hereby given, for the information and guidance of such Officers, Non-commissioned Officers, and Soldiers, and of the representatives of such Officers, Non-commissioned Officers, and Soldiers, as may desire to receive their shares in England, that the distribution, which will commence at this Office on Wednesday the 3d day of September next, must (according to the Act 54th George Third, cap. 86) cease on Tuesday the 2d day of December following, and that the shares then remaining unclaimed will be paid over by me to Chelsea Hospital, or to the East India Company; —that is to say, the shares unclaimed belonging to Officers and Soldiers of His Majesty's army will be paid over to the Treasurer of Chelsea Hospital; and the shares unclaimed belonging to the forces of the East India Company will be paid over to the said Company, for the purpose of distribution in India, and subject to future instructions.

All persons belonging to His Majesty's forces whose shares (not having been claimed from me) shall be paid over to Chelsea Hospital, must apply for payment to the Deputy Treasurer of that establishment, pursuant to the Act of Parliament already referred to.

It will, therefore, be to the advantage of all concerned, especially to persons belonging to the forces of the East India Company, to apply for their shares *as soon as possible*.

In order to save claimants the expence of powers of attorney, et cetera, I now apprise them, that any Officer, Non-commissioned Officer, or Soldier, entitled to participate in this prize-money, may (if in London) receive the amount due to him in person from me, on satisfying me that he is the person entitled to it; or (if at a distance from London) he may draw upon me for the amount, according to the following forms and instructions; but all such bills must be presented to me on or before the 2d day of December next.

When the signatures of Officers who may draw bills for prize-money are not known to me, it will be necessary for them to adopt measures to satisfy me of their authenticity, previous to my accepting them.

It will also be necessary for the representatives of deceased Officers to produce to me a probate of the will, or letters of administration (as the case may be), granted by the Prerogative Court of Canterbury, or by the Court of the Bishop of London, before I can pay to them, or to their order, the shares due to those they represent.

And with respect to the shares of Non-commissioned Officers and Soldiers of His Majesty's forces, the Act of 58th George Third, cap. 73, directs, that the distributing agent shall not pay the share of any Non-commissioned Officer or Soldier, to any person or persons whatsoever other than the Non-commissioned Officer or Soldier entitled to the same, or to the next of kin, or executor, or administrator of such Non-commissioned Officer or Soldier, or to the agent of some regiment, battalion, or corps of His Majesty's army or militia, duly authorised by the party entitled thereto to receive the same.

All bills drawn in Great Britain and Ireland by Officers must be on stamps of the usual value; and all orders drawn by Non-commissioned Officers and Privates must, according to Act of Parliament, be upon a shilling stamp, when the amount of the share exceeds forty shillings.

Receipts are exempted from stamp duty.

As much injury may be done to Soldiers and their representatives entitled to prize-money, by certificates being signed in favour of persons not entitled thereto, it is requested that great caution may be used on the present occasion; and it is declared by the Act 54th George Third, cap. 86, that if any person shall publish or utter as true, or shall aid or assist in uttering or publishing as true, or shall cause or procure to be uttered or published as true, any false, forged, or counterfeit letter, of attorney, bill, ticket, order, certificate, or assignment, last will, or any other power or authority whatsoever, in order to receive prize-money due or supposed to be due, to any Officer or Soldier or other person, with intent to defraud any person or corporation whatsoever, knowing the same to be false, forged, or counterfeited, every such person being thereof lawfully convicted, shall be deemed guilty of felony.
