The King has been pleased to give and grant unto David Marjoribanks, of Dulwich, in the county of Surrey, Esq. youngest son of Sir John Marjoribanks, late of Lees, in the county of Berwick, in North Britain, Bart. deceased, and to Marianne Sarah his wife, eldest daughter of Sir Thomas Haggerston, of Ellingham, in the county of Northumberland, Bart. by Margaret his late wife, only child of William Robertson, late of Ladykirk, in the said county of Berwick, Esq. also deceased, His royal licence and authority that they may (in compliance with the directions contained in a certain deed of entail and a trust or testamentary instrument, executed by the said William Robertson) use, bear, and constantly retain in all time hereafter, the surname of Robertson, and the arms and designation of Robertson of Ladykirk, and no other surname, arms, or designation; and that such surname of Robertson, and the name and designation of Robert-

son of Ladykirk, may be taken, used, and borne, and constantly retained by the issue of their marriage; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the Herald's Office, otherwise the said royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And also to command, that the said royal concession and declaration be recorded in His Majesty's College of Arms.
