THE King has been pleased to order a conget d'elire to the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Bristol, empowering them to elect a Bishop of that See, the same being void by the death of Doctor Robert Gray, late Bishop thereof; and His Majesty has also been pleased to recommend to the said Dean and Chapter Joseph Allen, Clerk, Doctor in Divinity, to be by them elected Bishop of the said See.
