NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing session, for leave to bring in a Bill to obtain an Act to consolidate, amend, extend, enlarge, or otherwise alter the powers and provisions contained in an Act of Parliament, passed in the third year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act for more effectually amending certain roads in the several parishes of Lambeth, Newington, Saint George Southwark, Bermondsey, and Christchurch, in the county of Surrey, and for watching, lighting, and otherwise improving the said roads;" and also in an Act, passed in the ninth year of the reign of His said late Majesty, intituled "An Act for more effectually amending the road leading from Stone's-end, in Blackman-street, in the borough of Southwark, in the county of Surrey, to Highgate, in the county of Sussex, and several other roads therein mentioned, and for other purposes relating thereto;" by which Act so to be obtained, it is intended to consolidate the said several roads, and place the repair and management thereof under the trustees to be by that Act appointed, or such parts of the said several roads as may be deemed expedient to be united; also to authorise the said trustees to continue or take down all and every or any of the toll-gates, bars, turnpikes, and toll-houses on the said roads, and to erect other toll-gates, bars, turnpikes, and toll-houses in lieu thereof or in addition thereto as

may be thought proper, and at such several toll-gates, bars, turnpikes, or toll-houses to demand and receive all and every the tolls granted and made payable under and by virtue of the Acts of Parliament above referred to, or such other tolls as shall be granted by the Act to be applied for as aforesaid; also to empower the said trustees to water the said several roads, or any part or parts thereof, and during such time and seasons of the year as they may direct, and for that purpose to demand and take a toll or tolls upon such road or roads as shall be directed by the said trustees to be watered; also to authorise the relinquishment of the repair of the carriage way of such of the said roads as the said trustees may deem expedient; and the repair of all and every the footpaths by the sides of the several roads included in the said Acts, or either of them, or any part or parts of such footpaths, and place the repair of the roads and footpaths, when relinquished, under the laws for regulating and repairing highways in England, or under the management of the commissioners or trustees for repairing the highways in the respective parishes in which such roads shall be; also to empower the trustees acting in the execution of the said Acts to pay off any debt, sum or sums of money, charged and secured, or that may be charged or secured, with interest upon the tolls for the said several roads, or such part or parts of the said debt or debts, sum or sums of money, as the said trustees may at any time or times think proper, and for that purpose from time to time, or at any time or times, to borrow and take up at interest, and to charge on the security of the tolls of the said roads, any sum or sums of money, at such rate of interest, upon such terms, and in such manner as the said trustees may deem proper or advisable, and to pay off and discharge all or any of the mortgages or securities upon the said tolls, or any of them, as the said trustees may think fit; all which several roads pass from, through, or into the several parishes hereinafter mentioned, or some of them, or some part or parts thereof, that is to say, Lambeth, Newington, Saint George Southwark, Bermondsey, Christchurch, Camberwell, Saint Paul Deptford, Streatham, Croydon, Sanderstead, Banstead, Coulsden, Wallingham, Caterham, Woldingham, Godstone, Tandridge, Horne, Lingfield, Outwood, Bletchingly, Nutfield, Clapham, Tooting, Mitcham, Morden, Merton, Carshalton, Sutton, Battersea, Wimbledon, Putney, Ham, Kingston, and Richmond, in the said county of Surrey; and East Grinstead, Charley, and Maresfield, in the said county of Sussex.—And notice is hereby also given, that it is intended by the said Act to be applied for as aforesaid, to obtain all enactments, powers, provisoes, provisions, regulations, and directions necessary, proper, or requisite for carrying into effect all and every or any of the several objects and purposes before stated or referred to.—Dated this 13th day of October 1834.
