

AT the Court at *St. James's*, the 15th day of December 1834.

PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THIS day the Right Honourable Stapleton Viscount Combermere; the Right Honourable James Archibald Lord Wharnclyffe; the Right Honourable Sir Edward Knatchbull, Bart.; Sir James Scarlett, Knt.; Sir Edward Sugden, Knt.; and Alexander Baring, were, by command of His Majesty, sworn of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and took their respective places at the Board accordingly.

His Majesty in Council was this day pleased to declare the Right Honourable James Earl of Rosslyn Lord President of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and his Lordship took his place at the Board accordingly.

His Majesty having been pleased to deliver the custody of the Privy Seal to the Right Honourable James Archibald Lord Wharnclyffe, the oath of Keeper of the Privy Seal was this day administered to him, and his Lordship took his place at the Board accordingly.

His Majesty having been pleased to appoint the Right Honourable Henry Goulburn to be one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, he was this day, by command of His Majesty, sworn one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State accordingly.
