ORDERS for the Court's change of mourning, on Thursday the 1st of January 1835, for His late Royal Highness the Duke of Gloucester, first cousin and brother in law to the King, viz.

The Ladies to wear black silk, fringed or plain linen, white gloves, necklaces and ear-rings, black or white shoes, fans and tippets.

The Gentlemen to wear black, full trimmed, fringed or plain linen, black swords and buckles.

The Court to change the mourning further on Thursday the 8th of January 1835, viz.

The Ladies to wear black silk or velvet, coloured ribbons, fans and tippets, or plain white, or white and gold, or white and silver stuffs, with black ribbons.

The Gentlemen to wear black coats, and black or plain white, or white and gold, or white and silver stuff waistcoats, full trimmed, coloured swords and buckles.

And on Thursday the 15th of January 1835, the Court to go out of mourning.

The King was pleased, on the 4th instant, to confer the honour of Knighthood upon John Ross, Esq. Captain in the Royal Navy, Companion of the Most Honourable Military Order of the Bath,

Knight of the Imperial Russian Order of Saint Anne of the second class, and Knight Commander of the Royal Swedish Military Order of the Sword.

The King has been pleased to grant unto Sir John Ross, Knight, Captain in the Royal Navy, and Companion of the Most Honourable Military Order of the Bath, His royal licence and authority, that he may accept and wear the insignia of the second class of the Imperial Russian Order of Saint Anne in Diamonds, and those of a Knight Commander of the Royal Swedish Military Order of the Sword, which His Imperial Majesty the Emperor of Russia and His Majesty the King of Sweden have respectively been pleased to confer upon that Officer, in testimony of their approbation of his services in the Baltic, in the year 1812:
