Lord Chamberlain's-Office, December 18, 1834.

ORDERS for the Court's change of mourning, on Thursday the 1st of January 1835, for His late Royal Highness the Duke of Gloucester, first cousin and brother in law to the King, viz.

The Ladies to wear black silk, fringed or plain linen, white gloves, necklaces and ear-rings, black or white shoes, fans and tippets.

The Gentlemen to wear black, full trimmed, fringed or plain linen, black swords and buckles.

The Court to change the mourning further on Thursday the 8th of January 1835, viz.

The Ladies to wear black silk or velvet, coloured ribbons, fans and tippets, or plain white, or white and gold, or white and silver stuffs, with black ribbons.

The Gentlemen to wear black coats, and black or plain white, or white and gold, or white and silver stuff waistcoats, full trimmed, coloured swords and buckles.

And on Thursday the 15th of January 1835, the Court to go out of mourning.

Whitehall, December 26, 1834.

The King has been pleased to direct letters patent to be passed under the Great Seal, constituting and appointing the Right Honourable Sir Robert Peel, Bart.; the Right Honourable William Yates Peel; Henry Pelham Clinton, Esq. commonly called Earl of Lincoln; William David Murray, Esq. commonly called Viscount Stormont; Charles Ross, Esq.; and William Ewart Gladstone, Esq. to be Commissioners for executing the offices of Treasurer of the Exchequer of Great Britain and Lord High Treasurer of Ireland.
