And, as a further encouragement, a reward of FIFTY POUNDS is hereby offered by the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and a further reward of FIFTY POUNDS by the Constables of Birmingham, to any person (except as aforesaid) who shall discover the said offender or offenders, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted of the said offence.
