An Act to authorise the Newcastle-upon-Tyne and Carlisle Railway Company to make an additional branch railway or tramroad, and for other purposes connected with their undertaking.

An Act to amend an Act for improving the navigation of the River Cart, and for deepening and extending the harbour of Paisley, in the county of Renfrew.
