**T**HIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorised by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by His Majesty, for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read*; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering certain Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act for continuing to His Majesty, until the fifth day of July one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, certain duties on sugar imported into the united kingdom for the service of year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-five.

An Act to indemnify such persons in the united kingdom as have omitted to qualify themselves for offices and employments, and for extending the time limited for those purposes respectively, until the twenty-fifth day of March one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six; to permit such persons in Great Britain as have omitted to make and file affidavits of the execution of indentures of clerks to attorneys and solicitors, to make and file the same, on or before the first day of Hilary Term one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six; and to allow persons to make and file such affidavits, although the persons whom they served shall have neglected to take out their annual certificates.

An Act to regulate the importation of corn into the Isle of Man.

An Act to continue to the thirty-first day of December one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, and from thence to the end of the then next session of Parliament, an Act of the tenth year of His late

Majesty's reign, for providing for the government of His Majesty's settlements in Western Australia, on the western coast of New Holland.

An Act to allow until the twenty-eighth day of July one thousand eight hundred and thirty five, the importation of certain articles, duty free, into the island of Dominica, and to indemnify the Governor and others for having permitted the importation of such articles duty free.

An Act for enlarging the powers of an Act, passed in the ninth year of the reign of King George the Fourth, to consolidate and amend several Acts for the further improvement of the port of London, by making docks and other works at Blackwall, for the accommodation of East India shipping.

An Act to alter and amend three several Acts for paving, cleansing, and improving the town of Dover, and for making further improvements in the said town

An Act for more effectually repairing, improving, and preserving the harbour and quay of Wells, in the county of Norfolk.

An Act for lighting, watching, and improving the parish of Tormoham, in the county of Devon.

An Act for improving and regulating the town of Aberystwyth, in the county of Cardigan, and for supplying the inhabitants thereof with water.

An Act for establishing a new market for live stock and agricultural produce, and erecting a market house or corn exchange, in the city of Winchester.

An Act for improving the haven of Great Yarmouth, in the county of Norfolk, and the several rivers connected therewith; and for repairing or taking down and re-building a certain bridge over the said haven, at Great Yarmouth aforesaid, and a certain bridge called Saint Olave's-bridge, over the River Waveney, in the counties of Norfolk and Suffolk; and for suspending for a limited period certain duties payable to the Corporation of Great Yarmouth, and imposing other duties in lieu thereof.

An Act for better supplying with water the town

of Ashton-under-Lyne and the neighbourhood thereof, within the Parish of Ashton-under-Lyne, in the county palatine of Lancaster.

An Act for removing the markets held in the town of Cardiff, in the county of Glamorgan, and for providing other market places in lieu thereof.

An Act for altering, amending, and extending the powers and provisions of an Act of the sixth year of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, for the regulation of buildings in the town of Liverpool, and for the other purposes therein mentioned; and for granting further and additional powers for the improvement and regulation of the said town, and the preservation of property therein from fires and otherwise.

An Act for paving, lighting, and watching the town and parish of Downham-market, in the county of Norfolk.

An Act to enable the inhabitants of Grosvenor-square, in the county of Middlesex, more effectually to pave, cleanse, light, water, and embellish the said square.

An Act for removing the markets held in the town and borough of Neath, in the county of Glamorgan, and for providing a new market place in the said town, in lieu thereof.

An Act to make and maintain a railway from Stanrig and Arbuckle, in the county of Lanark, to the Union Canal at Causewayend, in the county of Stirling.

An Act to enable the London and Birmingham Railway Company to extend and alter the line of such railway, and for other purposes relating thereto.

An Act to enable the Leeds and Selby Railway Company to improve the line of the said railway, and for amending and enlarging the powers and provisions of an Act relating to such railway.

An Act for making a railway from Preston to Wyre, and for improving the harbour of Wyre, in the county palatine of Lancaster.

An Act for consolidating the shares in the Wilts and Berks Canal Navigation, and for extending the powers of the act of incorporation of the Company of Proprietors of the said canal.

An Act for providing, in or near the burgh of Cupar, more extensive accommodation for holding the courts and meetings of the Sheriff, Justices of the Peace, and Commissioners of Supply of the county of Fife, and for the custody of the records of the said county.

An Act for further regulating the statute labour, and repairing the highways and bridges, in the county of Edinburgh.

An Act for more effectually making, repairing, and maintaining the turnpike roads in the county of Edinburgh.

An Act for improving and more effectually repairing the several roads leading into and from the city of Worcester.

An Act for repairing the roads from Sevenoaks-common to Woodgate, Tunbridge Wells, and Kipping's-cross, and from Tunbridge Wells to Woodgate, in the county of Kent.

An Act for more effectually repairing the Launceston turnpike roads, and making certain additional roads.

An Act for more effectually repairing and improving the road from the junction of the Oldstock road with the Downton road, near Harnham-hill, through Blandford and Dorchester to Askerswell-hill, in the counties of Wilts and Dorset.

An Act for more effectually repairing and improving the road from Newry to Charlemont, through the county of Armagh.

And eighteen private Bills.

A letter, of which the following is a translation, has been received by S. G. Marshall, Esq. His Majesty's Consul at Calais, from the French Commissary of Marine at that port:

SIR,

*Calais, June 24, 1835.*

YOU are aware that the gun brig, *La Lilloise*, commanded by Lieutenant De Blossville, was despatched, in the spring of 1833, to the coasts of Iceland and Greenland; and that, since the month of August of that year, no tidings have been heard of that vessel.

In 1834, the *Bordelaise* was sent in search of the *Lilloise*, though without success; and a corvette, *La Recherche*, lately sailed from Cherbourg for the same purpose.

The *Moniteur* of June 20 contains a report, presented to the King, on this subject by the Minister of the Marine, and His Majesty, as you will have seen, has determined,

1stly. That a sum of one hundred thousand francs, shall be paid to any French or foreign mariners, who shall bring back to their country, either all or part of the commissioned officers and crew of the *Lilloise*.

2dly. That a pecuniary recompense, proportioned to the importance of the service performed, shall be allowed to those who shall first be able to communicate a certain account of them, or procure to France the restitution of any of the papers and effects which have belonged to that expedition.

His Excellency has directed me to make this resolution known as generally as possible, and I think, I cannot do better than inform you of it, in order that you may employ such means as are in your power to acquaint with it the masters of English vessels engaged in the whale and cod fishery in the North Sea.

HALF-PAY AND RETIRED-PAY TO NAVAL OFFICERS  
AND OFFICERS OF THE ROYAL MARINES.

NOTICE is hereby given, that on the receipt in the Wages Department at the Admiralty-office, Somerset-place, of the affidavit or certificate of identity required from each Officer by His Majesty's Orders in Council, a bill for the amount of the half-pay or retired-pay due will be made out in this Department, which will be payable by the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy, on the following days, viz.

On the 10th and 11th of July, to Masters, Surgeons, and Purseers, and their Attorneys.

On the 13th, 14th, and 15th of July, to Lieutenants at 5s. a day and under, and their Attorneys

On the 16th and 17th of July, to Lieutenants at 7s and 6s. a day, and Chaplains, and their Attorneys.

On the 20th, 21st, and 22d of July, to Admirals, Lieutenant-Generals, Major-Generals, Colonels, Lieutenant-Colonels, Majors, Captains, Commanders, and Retired Commanders, and their Attorneys.

Great inconvenience having been experienced by the claims of Officers, who have not chosen to receive their half-pay or retired-pay on the days fixed for their rank, being brought forward on the days appointed for the payment of half-pay and retired-pay to Officers of different ranks; notice is hereby given, that no such claims can in future be attended to on the days not appointed for Officers of those ranks; but for the accommodation of such Officers, and also for the convenience of those who may not have transmitted their affidavits or certificates sufficiently early to admit of payment on the above-mentioned days, a recall will take place on the 24th and 25th of July.

After which the half-pay and retired-pay will be payable on the first and third Wednesday in every month, excepting during the general payment.

Officers residing in or near London, and wishing to receive their half-pay or retired-pay in person, are requested to deliver their affidavits or certificates into the Wages-office at the Admiralty, Somerset-house, or transmit them to the Secretary of the Admiralty, immediately on the expiration of each quarter; and those employing agents are also requested to furnish their agents with their

affidavits or certificates with the same dispatch, for unless such documents are delivered into this Office early, delay in the payment must unavoidably ensue

As it sometimes happens that Officers apply personally for their half-pay or retired-pay, without having previously sent in their affidavits or certificates with the same dispatch as required by the usual advertisement, any delay or inconvenience to which they might be subject by this oversight, it is in the power of the Officers themselves to prevent, by an adherence to the existing regulations.

Under the authority of the Statutes relating to the pay of the Navy, besides the above-mentioned modes, Officers may receive their half-pay or retired-pay in any of the following ways, viz.

1st. By drawing a bill for the amount, in which case they are to give notice thereof; by letter, to the Secretary of the Admiralty, marked, in the corner, "Half-pay, or Retired-pay, Accountant-General," and thereupon the proper form of a bill of exchange will be sent to them.

2d. By a remittance bill, or permanent remittance bill, payable to them at or in the neighbourhood of their residence, by the Collector of Customs or Excise.

3d. By extract or permanent remittance bill, at a Dock-yard, where there is an establishment of Pay Clerks.

In either of the two latter cases, they must give a like notice to the Secretary of the Admiralty, marked in the same manner, and a remittance bill, or extract, will thereupon be made out and transmitted to them.

In all cases, the Officer signifying his desire of payment is to state at the foot of his letter, his Christian and surnames, his rank, and a full description of his residence.

MEM.—Bills of exchange drawn under or by virtue of the Act of 11 Geo. 4, cap. 20, are not liable to the stamp duty.

No persons residing out of His Majesty's dominions are entitled to the privileges of this Act.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

Dock-Office, Liverpool, June 30, 1835.

(All Bearings imply by Compass.)

THE Trustees of the Liverpool Docks and Harbour hereby give notice, that, in accordance with the recent survey of Captain Denham, R. N. the following improvements in the lighting, beaconing, and buoing of the approaches to the port, will be in operation on and after the night of the 1st of August next, viz.

POINT LYNUS LIGHT.—This light, hitherto so situate as to preclude seeing it seaward, and merely shown by a single reflector upon the long shore aspects, will be advanced to the pitch of the Point, and exhibited from a castellated building (with white basement) recently erected thereon, with a powerful steady light, of the natural colour, pro-

duced by 13 argand lamps and reflectors, ranging over 211 degrees of the northern and south eastern horizon, at an elevation of 128 feet above half-tide level, rendering it visible in clear weather six to seven leagues from a ship's deck, or within one league of taking up the N. W. Light-ship off Liverpool. This light is so masked for local inshore effect, as to obscure itself when brought eastward of S. E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  E. which clears the Middle-house  $\frac{1}{4}$  of a mile, or northward of N. by W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W. which clears the Dalias Rocks  $\frac{1}{2}$  of a mile, and indicating when you ought to tack out of Red Wharf-bay.

The Formby Floating Light will, on and after the same night, show its natural colour with increased power, in lieu of the red light hitherto exhibited.

The Rock Light-house will exhibit a black ball above its balcony, whilst 12 feet water remains in the Rock Gut by day; and a steady light (from a lower chamber in the western aspect) will indicate the same by night.

A Floating Beacon will be moored in the place of the present Fairway Buoy, at the New Channel entrance, presenting a black conical figure, bearing this inscription - "To New Channell, E.  $\frac{3}{4}$  S." and surmounted by a large black ball, elevated 23 feet, with a self-acting bell.

**NEW CHANNEL LAND MARK.**—In order to render the line of leading objects into the New Channel more available in hazy weather or accidental absence of the light-vessel, a dark bulky frame work has been erected on the high-water shore of Formby, in line of light-vessel and light house.

**HOYLAKE LIGHT-HOUSES.**—These buildings, in order to distinguish them more effectually from the neighbouring houses, will henceforth be painted white.

**DOVE BEACONS.**—Two beacons will appear on Dove-point, instead of one, affording a leading mark when brought in line upon the bearing of south by east for passing between the Dove Spit and East Hoyle, in reference to the eastern entrance of Hoylake.

The buoys will henceforth be distinguished by the initial of the channel or bank they respectively occupy, i. e. F. Formby; C. Crosby; N. New Channel; H. F. Half-tide Swatchway; H. Horse Channel; H. E. Helbre Swatch; R. Rock Channel; L. Lake (Hoylake); B. Beggars Patch; K. Knowl (Newcome). They will likewise be numbered in rotation, No. 1 always denoting the outer or seaward buoy of the channel its letter indicates, and the turning point or elbow of each channel will be distinguished by a perch buoy, bearing in mind that red buoys lie on the starboard hand, and black upon the larboard, when running in.

**ADDITIONAL BUOYS.**—Eighteen additional buoys will be laid down by the above date (making 56 in all), and thus disposed: one (red) and one (black) on each side of the New Channel, between the present buoys; one (red) on the eastern edge of the Jordan Bank, between the present buoys; one (black) on edge of Formby Bank, next northward of Crosby Buoy; two (black) on the low-water edge of Bootle Sands; one (red) on edge of "Rip-raps;" one (red) on edge of Mockbeggars Wharf, between the Dove Spit and West Wharf Buoys; one (black and white) on west end of Beggars Patch; two

(red) on east edge of East Hoyle Bank, within the present buoys; two (red and white) on the west side of Helbre Swatch; two (black) on east side of ditto; one (white with black stripe) showing the fairway of Half-tide Swatchway, one mile westward of Formby Fairway Buoy; one (red) on the edge of Hoyle, in Hoylake, abreast of the church; and a black (nun) buoy, marked K. 1, upon that part of a shoal now called Newcome Knowl, which has lately grown up so as to have but 14 feet water upon it at low-water springs; this buoy bears from the N. W. Light ship, E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S.  $2\frac{1}{2}$  miles, and from the New Channel Floating Beacon, S. S. W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W. 2 miles.

The whole of the foregoing will be clearly shown and explained in the forthcoming completed edition of Captain Denham's Survey, of which the Dock Trustees published an extract chart last year, under sanction of the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty.
