

his Grace the Archbishop of Dublin, Chancellor; the Very Reverend the Dean of St. Patrick's Cathedral, Register; Lord Viscount Forbes, Secretary; the Honourable Francis-Charles Stanhope, Usher; and Sir William Betham, Ulster King of Arms attendant on the Order.

At two o'clock, the Knights Companions were called over by Ulster, and proceeded into the presence of the Sovereign, who was seated in the chair of state, and the Knights Companions took their respective seats at the table, according to the order of their stalls.

Then, by command of the Sovereign, Major the Honourable Francis-Charles Stanhope was introduced into the Chapter-room, and, kneeling near His Majesty, the oath of office having been administered to him by the Prelate, the Sovereign was pleased to invest him with the ribband and badge as Usher of the Order, and to confer upon him the honour of Knighthood; he, thereupon, had the honour to kiss His Majesty's hand, and retired to his place at the table.

By command of the Sovereign, General the Earl of Cork and Orrery was then introduced into the Royal Presence, and knighted by His Majesty with the sword of state, after which his Lordship, having kissed the Sovereign's hand, retired. The Earl of Howth was then introduced, and, having in like manner received the honour of Knighthood from the Sovereign, also retired.

Ulster then announced to the Chapter, that Edmund Earl of Cork and Orrery had been declared a Knight of the Most Illustrious Order of St. Patrick, and his Lordship being received at the door of the Chapter-room by the Marquess Conyngham and the Earl of Leitrim, the two junior Knights present, was conducted between them to His Majesty, preceded by Ulster (bearing the ensigns of the Order upon a velvet cushion) and by the Usher of the Order. The Earl, kneeling near the Sovereign, and Ulster presenting on his knee the ribband and badge of the Order, His Majesty, assisted by His Royal Highness the Duke of Cumberland and the Earl of Caledon, the two senior Knights present, put the same over the Earl of Cork's right shoulder, pronouncing the admonition and administering the oath; after which his Lordship had again the honour to kiss His Majesty's hand.

The Earl of Howth was then introduced, and invested with the same ceremonies.

The Chapter being ended, Ulster, by command of the Sovereign, called over the Knights Companions, and a procession was made from the Royal Closet in the same order as before.
