AT the Court at *St. James's*, the 26th day of *August* 1835,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the third and fourth year of His Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for the general regulation of the "Customs," it is, among other things, enacted, that goods of places within the limits of the East India Company's charter shall be imported only into such ports of the United Kingdom as shall be approved of by the Lords of the Treasury, and declared by an Order in Council to be fit and proper for such importation :

And whereas the several ports of Whitehaven and Waterford have, with certain limitations, been approved of by the Lords of His Majesty's Treasury for that purpose, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is thereupon pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared, that the ports of Whitehaven and Waterford are, respectively, fit and proper for the importation of goods from places within the limits of the East India Company's charter, save and except that such ports shall not be deemed fit and proper for the importation of tea until after the first day of July one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commis-

sioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorised by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by His Majesty, for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering certain Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An Act for raising the sum of thirteen millions five hundred twenty-one thousand five hundred and fifty pounds by Exchequer Bills for the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-five.

An Act to carry into further execution the provisions of an Act, passed in the third and fourth years of His present Majesty, for compensating owners of slaves upon the abolition of slavery.

An Act to exempt certain retailers of spirits to a small amount from the additional duties on licences, and to discontinue the Excise survey on wine, and the use of permits for the removal thereof.

An Act to provide for the better collection of the duties on wood, the produce of places in Europe.

An Act for granting relief to the island of Dominica, and to amend an Act of the second and third years of His present Majesty, for enabling His

Majesty to direct the issue of Exchequer Bills to a limited amount for the purposes therein mentioned.

An Act to authorise the Court of Directors of the East India Company to suspend the execution of the provisions of the Act of the third and fourth William the Fourth, chapter eighty-five, so far as they relate to the creation of the Government of Agra.

An Act to repeal so much of an Act, passed in the third and fourth years of His present Majesty, as relates to the amount of the salary granted to the Clerk of the Crown in Chancery; and to make other provisions in relation to the said office.

An Act to amend the law relating to securities given for considerations arising out of gaming, usurious, and certain other illegal transactions.

An Act to repeal an Act of the ninth year of His late Majesty, for regulating the carriage of passengers in merchant vessels from the United Kingdom to the British possessions on the continent and islands of North America; and to make further provision for regulating the carriage of passengers from the United Kingdom.

An Act for enlarging the powers of magistrates in the appointment of special constables.

An Act for the better prevention and more speedy punishment of offences endangering the public peace in Ireland.

An Act to authorise the granting of superannuation allowances to the Commissioners and Officers of the Courts for the Relief of Insolvent Debtors.

An Act to amend, until the end of the next session of Parliament, an Act of the second year of His present Majesty, for making provision for the dispatch of the business now done by the Court of Exchequer in Scotland.

An Act to render certain marriages valid, and to alter the law with respect to certain voidable marriages.

An Act to consolidate and amend the laws relating to highways in that part of Great Britain called England.

An Act for continuing until the first day of June one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven, the several Acts for regulating the turnpike roads in Great Britain, which will expire on the first day of June one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, or with the next session of Parliament.

An Act for making a railway from Bristol to join the London and Birmingham Railway, near London, to be called the Great Western Railway, with branches therefrom to the towns of Bradford and Trowbridge, in the county of Wilts.

An Act to rectify a mistake in an Act, passed in the present session of Parliament, for lighting, watching, and improving the parish of Townsham, in the county of Devon.

An Act to improve and maintain the Port Dundas-road, and to make and maintain another road in the county of Lanark.
