**M**R. WARRINGTON, His Majesty's Agent and Consul-General at Tripoli, has transmitted to Lord Glenelg, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonial Department, an official note, of which the following is a translation, which has been addressed to Mr. Warrington by his Excellency Esseit Mustapha Nedgib:

(Translation.)

*Esseit Mustapha Nedgib, by the Grace of God, Pacha Vizier of the Sublime Ottoman Porte, Lieutenant-General of Tripoli and its Dependencies, to Hammer Warrington, His Britannic Majesty's Consul-General at Tripoli.*

SIR,

DURING the troubles which have for three years past desolated this country, there has arisen a ruinous abuse, which no Government can tolerate, that of embarking and landing merchandise and other articles at other places than the established ports. This illicit commerce, besides causing the greatest injury to the revenue, is extremely prejudicial to lawful commerce and to the tranquillity of the country. We, therefore, inform you, Sir, that we have given the necessary orders to several of our vessels to be ready to cruise on the coast; and you will accordingly have the goodness to inform those of your countrymen, and all others whom it may concern, that henceforth, all coasting traffic is

expressly forbidden, and that no commercial intercourse will be allowed at any other places than the ports of Tripoli, Bengasi, and Derna; and consequently, that from the 1st September 1835, all vessels, boats, or craft, &c. which may be found in the prohibited places, will be seized, it being declared that the whole of this coast is, from this moment, to be regarded as in a state of blockade, excepting only the three ports above mentioned.

FORAGE, viz. Oats, Hay, and Straw, to His Majesty's Cavalry and Artillery Horses in Barracks, in Great Britain.

STRAW for PAILLASSES, at the several Barracks and Ordnance Stations in Great Britain, and in the Channel Islands.

That proposals in writing, addressed to the Secretary to the Board of Ordnance, sealed up and marked on the outside “Tender for Army Supplies,” will be received at the Ordnance-Office, Pall Mall, on or before Tuesday the 6th day of October next; but none will be received after eleven o'clock on that day.

Separate proposals must be made for bread, for oats, for forage, and for paillasse straw; and proposals must also be made separately for each county and island, except for the counties comprising North and South Wales, all of which must be included in one tender; likewise the islands of Guernsey, Jersey, and Alderney, as also the several counties in North Britain; and each proposal must have the letter which is annexed to the tender properly filled up by two persons of known property, engaging to become bound with the party tendering, in the amount stated in the printed particulars, for the due performance of the contract; and no proposal will be noticed unless made on a printed form of tender, and the prices expressed in words at length; and should it so happen that during the continuance of the contract no troops should be supplied by virtue of the same, the amount of the stamps on the contract and bond, paid in the first instance by the contractor, will be refunded to him.

Persons who may make tenders are particularly requested to observe, that the Foot Guards are not in future to be supplied with bread by the Contractor, neither are the Household Cavalry in the county of Middlesex; and persons tendering are desired not to make use of any forms but those recently printed, which may be had upon application at the Office of the Secretary to the Board of Ordnance, Pall Mall, between the hours of ten and four; and of the Barrack-Masters in the islands of Guernsey, Jersey, and Alderney.

N.B. The practice of allowing letters to and from Contractors and their Agents, to pass free of postage, is discontinued; but the official correspondence between the Contractors and Regimental and other Officers will be forwarded as usual. The Board of Ordnance and their Officers will not, however, be responsible for any letters, money, or orders for money, which may be so forwarded.

### CONTRACT FOR IRISH BEEF AND PORK.

Department of the Comptroller for Victualling and Transport Services, Somerset-Place, July 20, 1835.

**T**HE Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland do hereby give notice, that on Thursday the 24th of September next, at one o'clock, they will be ready to treat with such persons as may be willing to contract for the supply of a quantity of

Irish Salt Meat, equal to 9,000 Navy Tierces of Beef, and 9,500 Navy Tierces of Pork,

in separate tenders, all to be cured in the ensuing season; their Lordships reserving to themselves the power, when the tenders are opened, of contracting either for the whole or for such part thereof only as they may deem fit, or of not contracting for any part.

The said meat is to be delivered, seven eighth parts thereof in tierces, and the remaining one eighth part thereof in barrels, into His Majesty's Victualling Stores at Deptford, Portsmouth, Plymouth, and Cork, in such proportions as shall hereafter be directed—one half thereof by the 28th day of February, and the other half by the 31st day of May 1836, and to be paid for by bills payable at sight.

The conditions of the contract may be seen at this Office, or by applying to the Agent for the Victualling at Cork; or to the Collectors of His Majesty's Customs at Limerick, Belfast, Waterford, and Newry, or to the Secretary of the Postmaster-General at Dublin.

No tender for a less quantity than shall be equal to 300 tierces of beef, or to 300 tierces of pork, will be admitted; but all tenders for such small quantities will be accepted, if at a lower price than that for which larger quantities are offered.

No tender will be received after one o'clock on the day of treaty, nor any noticed unless the party attends, or some person on his behalf, duly authorised in writing; and it is to be expressly understood, that the tenders must contain a separate price for the beef and a separate price for the pork; and that every tender must also specify the prices both in figures and words at length, or the tenders will be rejected.
