Second and Last Edictal Citation.**

By virtue of an extract from the minutes of the proceedings of the Roll Court, dated 10th August 1835;

I, the undersigned, First Marshal for this District, in the name and on behalf of the representatives of the estate of the late J. L. Barnstedt, deceased, and those of the estate of the late Richard Hooton, deceased; do hereby, for the second and last time, by edict, cite all known and unknown creditors against the respective estates of the late J.
