THE King has been pleased to direct letters patent to be passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, conferring the honour of Knighthood upon William Norris, Esq. Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Island of Ceylon.

His Majesty has been graciously pleased to approve, that in future the 1st Regiment of Oxfordshire Yeomanry Cavalry shall bear the appellation of the 1st, or Queen's Own, Regiment of Oxfordshire Yeomanry Cavalry.

The King has been pleased to give and grant unto Lancelot South, of Cunningham-place, St. John's-wood, in the county of Middlesex, Gent. son of the late John South, of Harlow, in the county of Essex, by Anne his wife, only child and heir of John Archer, deceased, which John Archer was cousin german of Susanna, now widow and relict of Lancelot Burton, late of Newcastle street, Strand, and of Maida-vale, in the said county of Middlesex, Gent. also deceased, His royal licence and authority that he, the said Lancelot South, and his issue may, in compliance with an earnest wish and desire of

the said Susanna Burton, and to manifest his and their grateful and affectionate respect for the memory of the said Lancelot Burton, take and henceforth use the surnames of Archer and Burton, in lieu of the surname of South; and that he and they may bear the arms of Archer and Burton quarterly, Burton in the first quarter; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the Heralds' Office, otherwise the said licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And also to command, that the said royal concession and declaration be registered in His Majesty's College of Arms.

The Lord Chief Justice of the Court of Common Pleas has appointed Mr. Isaac Phelps, of South Brent, near Cross, in the county of Somerset, Solicitor, one of the Perpetual Commissioners for taking the acknowledgments of deeds by married women, under the recent Act for the abolition of fines and recoveries.
