## POST HORSE DUTIES.

## Stamps and Taxes, London, October 30, 1835.

NOTICE is hereby given, that, by virtue of an Act, passed in the sccond and third years of the reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act to repeal the duties, under the management of the Commissioners of Stamps, on stage carriages and on horses let for hire in Great Britain, and to grant other duties in lieu thereof, and also to consolidate and amend the laws relating thereto," the Commissioners of Stamps and Taxes will put up the Duties by the said Act granted on horses let for hire, at the Crown and Anchor Tavern, in the Strand, on Fiday the 11 th day of December next, at eleven oclock in the forenoon, subject to such conditions as will then be produced, to be let to farm, for the term of one year, from the lst day of February next, inclusive, in the several divisions or districts following, that is to say:
