HE King has been graciously pleased to nominate and appoint Lord George William Russell to be His Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary to His Majesty the King of Prussia.

The King has also been graciously pleased to nominate and appoint Sir George Shee, Bart. to be His Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary to His Majesty the King of Wurtemberg.

In pursuance of the directions of an Act, passed in the twenty-fourth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act "to repeal so much of two Acts, made in the tenth" and fifteenth years of the reign of His present "Majesty, as authorises the Speaker of the House of Commons to issue his warrant to the Clerk of the Crown, for making out writs for the election of Members to serve in Parliament, in the manner therein mentioned, and for substituting other provisions for the like purposes:"

I do hereby give notice, that the death of the Honourable William Charles Wentworth Fitzwilliam, commonly called Viscount Milton, late a Member serving in this present Parliament for the northern division of the county of Northampton, hath been certified to me in writing, under the hands of two Members serving in this present Parliament; and that I shall issue my warrant to the Clerk of the Crown to make out a new writ for the electing of a Knight to serve in this present Parliament for the said northern division of the said county, at the end of fourteen days after the insertion of this notice in the London Gazette.
