NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the next session, for an Act for improving the several parishes of Saint Saviour and Saint George the Martyr, in the borough of Southwark, in the county of Surrey, and of Christchurch, in the same county, by opening, making, and maintaining the several new streets hereinafter mentioned, that is to say; a new street, commencing at or from the east side of Blackfriars-road, opposite Stamford-street, in the said parish of Christchurch, thence proceeding in nearly a straight line to, and terminating in, Blackman-street, nearly opposite Saint George's Church and the Great Dover-road in the said parish of Saint George the Martyr; a new street, commencing from or out of the last-mentioned new street, at or near a certain street called Gravel-lane, in the said parish of Saint Saviour, thence proceeding in nearly a straight line to a certain street or road called Bridge-street, nearly opposite Castle-street, thence proceeding in nearly a straight line along Castle street to, and terminating at or near, the Town-hall, in the said borough of Southwark; a new street, commencing from and out of the first-mentioned new street, at its commencement on the east side of Blackfriars-road, nearly opposite Stamford-street, in the said parish of Christchurch, thence proceeding in nearly a direct line to, or near to, a new chapel in a certain street called New Park-street, in the said parish of Saint Saviour, thence passing along New Park-street, under the archway of the Southwark-bridge-road, unto Park-street, at or near Bank-end, in the same parish, thence proceeding in nearly a straight line to the west end of Saint Saviour's Church, thence passing southwards, and terminating at or near to the Borough-market and York-street, and passing northwards from Saint Saviour's Church aforesaid through Montague-close, and terminating at the archway to Tooley-street, under the London-bridge-approaches, in the said parish of Saint Saviour: and that it is further intended to take power by the said Act to purchase lands, tenements, and hereditaments within the said several parishes, and to alter and divert existing streets, roads, passages, and places at or communicating with the lines of such intended new streets respectively; and that it is further intended to take power by the said

Act to raise money for the purposes of such Act, by means of an increase of the duties on coals at the port of London, or of the continuance of such duties, for a limited time, after the same would otherwise expire, or of a new duty on coals at the port of London for a limited time, or by some other means to be provided for by such Act.—Dated this 3d day of November 1835.
