An Act for granting to His Majesty, until the fifth day of July one thousand eight hundred and thirtyseven, certain duties on sugar imported into the United Kingdom, for the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six.

An Act to enable persons to make deposits of stock or Exchequer bills, in lieu of giving security by bond, to the Postmaster-General and Commissioners of Land Revenue, Customs, Excise, Stamps, and Taxes.
