On Monday last his Holines held a Confistury, wherein were proposed the Presentation to several Bishopricks: Some Propositions were also made for reducing the Cameral Taxes due to the facred Colledge, to a moderatien, which have been of late years leverely exacted, even to a grievar cr.

The fame day was publifht an Edict in favour of the People, for a free Commerce and Trade of Cora throughout all parts of the Ecclefiskical State, without any Impost, or the payment of fo much as a Licence.

A Courrier arriving here from the Abbot Rofpigliofi, the Popes Nephew, has brought him the welcome-newes of his recovery, and the great affiftance given him in his fickness by Monfegnor Bargellini the Nuncio, in Savoye, which has fo much tatified the Pope, that he bas liberally rewarded the Courrier, and intends to remove the Nuncio to an Employ-ment of greater Revenue; The Abbot will in little time be expedied here, being now in a condition of health to purfue his Voyage.
