## PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by an Act, passed in the third and fourth year of His Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for the general regulation of the "t" Customs," it is, among other things, enacted, that goods of places within the limits of the East India Company's charter shall be imported only into such ports of the United Kingdom as shall be approved of by the Lords of the Treasury, and declared by an Order in Council to be fit and proper for such importation:

And whereas the port of Gloucester, in the county of Gloucester, has been approved of by the Lords of His Majesty's Treasury for that purpose; His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is thereupon pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared, that the said port of Gloucester is fit and proper for the importation of goods from places within the limits of the East India Company's charter:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
