AT the Court at *St. James's*, the 5th day of *October* 1836,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by a certain Act of Parliament, passed in the session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of His present Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for the abolition of slavery throughout the British colonies; for promoting the industry of the manumitted slaves; and for compensating the persons hitherto entitled to the services of such slaves;" after reciting, that it was necessary that provision should be made for the apportionment, amongst the proprietors of the slaves to be manumitted by virtue of the said Act, in each of the said colonies respectively, of that part of the said compensation fund which should be so assigned, as in the said Act is therein before recited, to each of the respective colonies; it was, amongst other things, enacted, that any person having, or claiming to have, any right, title, or interest in or to any mortgage, judgement, charge, incumbrance, or other lien upon any slave or slaves to be manumitted under the said Act, might prefer such claims before the said Commissioners:

And it was further enacted, that the said Commissioners should proceed in the manner to be prescribed by any general rules to be framed in manner particularly mentioned, to enquire into, and adjudi-

cate upon, any such claims as might be so preferred to them, and should upon each such claim make their adjudication and award, in such manner and form as should be prescribed by any such general rules; and if any person interested in, or affected by, any such adjudication or award should be dissatisfied therewith, it should be lawful for such person to appeal therefrom to His Majesty in Council, and notice of any such appeal should be served upon the said Commissioners:

And it should be competent to His Majesty in Council to make and establish all such rules and regulations as to His Majesty should seem meet, respecting the time and manner of preferring and proceeding upon such appeals, and respecting the course to be observed in defending the same; which rules should be so framed as to promote, as far as might be consistent with justice, all practicable economy and dispatch in the proceeding until the decision thereof:

And it was further enacted, that the several adjudications and awards of the said Commissioners, unless duly appealed from within the respective times to be limited by His Majesty in Council for that purpose, should be final and conclusive and binding upon all persons interested therein, or affected thereby; and that the decisions of His Majesty in Council upon any such appeal should, in like manner, be final, binding, and conclusive:

And whereas His Majesty hath this day taken

into consideration the propriety of making and establishing certain rules and regulations, for limiting the time within which appeals shall be preferred to His Majesty in Council from any adjudication or award of the said Commissioners:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the said Act of Parliament, and in execution of the power in His Majesty in that behalf vested, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that whenever it shall happen that any person interested in, or affected by, any adjudication or award of the said Commissioners, shall be dissatisfied therewith, and shall be desirous to appeal therefrom to His Majesty in Council, then and in every such case, such person or persons shall duly lodge a petition of appeal, within fourteen days from the date of such adjudication or award, and shall forthwith serve a notice of such appeal upon the said Commissioners, by leaving the same at the office of the said Commissioners, and that no appeal from any adjudication or award of the said Commissioners shall be received, nor the proceedings under such adjudication or award be in any way suspended, unless such petition of appeal shall be so lodged, and notice thereof be so served on the said Commissioners, within the said period of fourteen days from the date of such adjudication or award as herein before mentioned.

London, Tilbury, and Gravesend Railway, via the Thames Haven Railway.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the next session, for leave to bring in a Bill for making and maintaining a railway, to be called the London, Tilbury, and Gravesend Railway, to commence on the north side of the River Thames, at or near the Ferry at Tilbury-fort, in the parish of West Tilbury and Chadwell, or one of them, in the county of Essex, and to terminate and connect with the Thames Haven Railway, at or near the road leading from South Ockendon to North Ockendon, in the said county of Essex; and for making or purchasing a ferry at the commencement of the said railway, near Tilbury-fort aforesaid; and also to make and maintain all bridges, culverts, viaducts, tunnels, archways, embankments, buildings, stations, wharfs, docks, quays, roads, and other works, material or necessary, to the said railway, or for the more complete use and enjoyment thereof respectively; and which said railway is intended to be made from, in, through, or into the several parishes, townships, and places following, that is to say, West Tilbury, East Tilbury, Little Thurrock, Grav's Thurrock, Stifford, Orsett, and South Ockendon, all in the county of Essex.

And it is also intended to apply for powers to be granted by the said Bill to authorise the taking of such fares, tolls, dues, rates, and sums of money as shall be mentioned in the said Bill; and for purchasing and holding lands, tenements, and hereditaments within the said several parishes, townships, and places, or elsewhere, for the purposes aforesaid:
