

PURSUANT to a Decree of the High Court of Chancery, made in two causes, intituled respectively Duke of Hamilton against Wenn, the Heir or Heirs at Law of the Right Honourable William Henry Earl of Rochford, deceased (who died on or about the 3d day of September 1830), are, on or before the 24th day of December 1836, to come in and make out his, her, or their claim or claims as such heir or heirs before Francis Cross, Esq. one of the Masters of the said Court, at his Chambers, in Southampton-Buildings, Chancery-Lane, London, or in default thereof he, she, and they will be peremptorily excluded the benefit of the said Decree.
