

"and Wales, in so far as respects the election of "Members to serve in Parliament," shall, conformably to the said last-mentioned Act, divide such county, riding, parts, or divisions into convenient polling districts, and assign one of such districts to each polling place.

And whereas the justices of the peace of the county of Somerset, in quarter sessions assembled, the second day of January one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven, have presented their petition to His Majesty, representing that the number of polling places for the western division of the said county of Somerset, are insufficient, and therefore praying, that Ilminster, Langport, Wiveliscombe, and Hunster, may be polling places for the said western division of the said county,

Now, therefore, His Majesty, having taken the said petition into consideration, doth, pursuant to the said Act of the seventh year of His reign, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, declare, order, and direct, that the said several places mentioned in the said petition, namely, Ilminster, Langport, Wiveliscombe, and Hunster, shall be polling places for the western division of the said county of Somerset; and further, that the justices of the peace, for the said county, assembled in quarter sessions or some special sessions, as mentioned in the said Act of the third year of His Majesty's reign, shall, conformably to the said last-mentioned Act, divide the said western division of the said county into convenient polling districts, and assign one of such districts to each polling place.
