Westminster, March 22, 1837.
THIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, authorised by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed
by His Majesty, for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to
An Act to apply the sum of two millions to the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven.

An Act to amend and enlarge the powers of an Act, passed in the first and second years of His present Majesty, for erecting a county hall and courts of justice, and also for providing accommodation for His Majesty's Justices of Assize, in and for the county of Worcester.

An Act for lighting with gas the town of Runcorn, otherwise called Higher Runcorn, and Lower Runcorn, and also the township or chapelry of Halton, both in the parish of Runcorn, in the county of Chester.

An Act for making and maintaining a turnpike road along the south side of the River Dee, in the county of Kincardine.

An Act for repairing, maintaining, and improving the road from the town of Rochdale to near Handbridge, near the town of Burnley, and other roads communicating therewith, and for making and maintainiug other roads also to communicate therewith, all in the county palatine of Lancaster.

Officers residing in or near Loondon, and wisthing to receive their half-pay or retired-pay in person; are requested to deliver their declarations. or certificates into this Office, or transmit them to His Majesty's Paymaster-Cieneral, immediately on the expiration of each quarter; and those employing agents are also requested to firmish their agents with their decharatious or certificates. with the same dispatch, for unless such documents are delivered into this Ofice early, delay in the payment wust unavoidably ensue.

As it sometimes happens that Officers apply persorially for their half-pay or retired-pay, without having previously sent in their declarations or certificates as required by . the usual advertisement, any delay or inconvenience to which they might be subject by this oversight, it is in the power of the Ollicers themselves to prevent, by an adherence to the existing regulations:

Under the authority of the Statutes relating to the pay of the Nary, besides the above-mentioned modes, Officers may receive their half-pay or re-tired-pay in any of the following ways, viz.
Jst: By drawing a bill. for the amount, on a form of bill to be sent to them from the Paymaster-General's Office, atter the receipt of the usual letter of apprication and declarntiou.
2d. Dy a remittance bill, or permanent remittance bill, payable to them at or in the neighbourbood of their residence, by the Collector of Customs or Excise.
3d. By payment at the Dock-yards at Portsmouth, Devouport, and Chathain, on presenting to the Pay Clerks the risual de-8 claration or certificate on the days appointeatr for paymient at thie respective ports. This mode will be found more coinvenient to Othicers living near any one of these ports, than either a bill of exchange or remittance.
In all cases," the Officer signifying his desire of payment is to state at the foot of his letter, his: Clristian and surnames; his rank, and a tull descriptiou of has residence.
Mem.-Bills of excliange drawn under or by virtue of the Act of 11 Geo. 4, cap. 20, arethot liable to the stamp duty.
No persons residing out of His Majesty's do. minions are eatitled to the privileges of this Act.
