Captain George Johnston Lenon, upon half-pay of the Portuguese Service, has been permitted to retire from the Army, with the sale of an Unattached commission, he being about to become a settler in the colonies. Dated 27th March 1837.

Whitehall, March 29, 1837.

The King has been pleased to grant unto John Hay, Esq. (commonly called Lord John Hay),

Captain in the Royal Navy and Companion of the Most Honourable Military Order of the Bath, the Commander of the British naval forces on the north coast of Spain. His royal licence and permission that he may accept and wear the grand cross of the royal and distinguished order of Charles the Third, which the Queen Regent of Spain has been pleased to confer upon that officer, in testimony of Her Catholic Majesty's royal approbation of the important services rendered by his Lordship at the siege of Bilbao, and that he may enjoy all the rights and privileges thereunto annexed.

And also to command that the said concession and especial mark of His royal favour be registered, together with the relative documents, in His Majesty's College of Arms.

Whitehall, March 20, 1837.

The King has been pleased to give and grant unto the Reverend Richard Lowndes, of Morden, in the county of Surrey, Clerk, second son of William Lowndes Stone, formerly William Lowndes, late of Baldwin Brightwell in the county of Oxford, Esq. deceased, by Elizabeth his wife, formerly Elizabeth Garth, spinster, one of the daughters and coheirs of Richard Garth, heretofore of Morden aforesaid, Esq. also deceased. His royal licence and authority, that he and his issue may, in compliance with a direction contained in the last will and testament of his maternal grandfather, the said Richard Garth, and in grateful respect to his memory, henceforth assume, and take and use, the surname of Garth, in lieu of his present surname of Lowndes; and that he and they may henceforth bear and use the arms of Garth, of Morden, only, in lieu of his present arms of Lowndes; such same being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the Herald's Office, otherwise the said licence and permission to be void and of none effect.

And also to command that this His Majesty's royal concession and declaration be registered in His College of Arms.
