Dublin, Sept. 21.

ON Tuesday last arrived here a Swedish ship of 200 Tuns laden with Salt, Brandy and Wine, having with much difficulty, by the favour of the Spring Tides, and timely assistance sent to her from the Merchants to whom she was consigned, been brought off from the South Sands near Kings End, on which she ran by a mistake of the Skipper.

From Galloway we are informed, that a French vessel of 70 Tuns laden with Green Cod, is lately brought in there by the *Albemarle*, a Privateer belonging to Sir Robert Holmes.

Falmouth, Sept. 23. The 20th Instant came in here a *Wlshinger* under the States pay for the West Indies, with the Articles and Proclamations for Peace, and Letters from the States.

The 22. three Dutch Merchantmen bound for France, put in here, and one *Genouese* homewards bound, and the same day arrived a Vessel from Portsmouth and another from London, both of them to load Pilchards.

Minthead, Sept. 24. Two Barks belonging to Swansey, and the *Mary* of this Town, laden with Wool and Cattle, are supposed to be cast away in the late ill weather.

West-Cowes, Sept. 25. Yesterday arrived here the *St. John* of *St. Valery* in France with Ballast, bound for *Bordeaux*, as also the *Samaritan* of *Wlshing*, with Picce Goods, bound for *Kinsale* and other parts of Ireland, intending from thence to pass with Provisions for the *Caribbe* Islands. Here came in also the *Providence* of *Dublin*, laden with Hides, Tallow and Provisions, bound for *Rouen*, but in her way, about six months since, was taken by a French Man of War and carried into *Brest*, where she continued till within the few dayes she cleared her self; by her we are told, that 10 French Men of War are now at *Brest*, and that the rest of the Fleet was at *St. Martins* with the Admiral *Monsieur de Beaufort*, who was daily expected at *Brest*.

Vicenna Sept. 11. We have here a warm report of a Match that is like to be Concluded between the Widow Empress and the King of *Poland*, that the Emperor will within a Months time give his Resolutions thereupon, which is believed will be in favour of it; and in order thereunto, the Count *Schaffgatch* his Imperial Majesties chief President in *Silesia*, is to be dispatched away for *Poland*.

The Spanish Ambassador has employed those great sums of money sent to him from *Spain*, in the raising of Forces in all the Countries belonging to the Emperor. Many men are also levied upon the Emperors account, intended also for the Succours of the Netherlands, which will in little time be ready to March.

'Tis said that the Duke of *Savoy* has lately demanded the Investiture of *Milan*, *Modena* and *Mantua*, threatening force in case of refusal.

From Hungary we are told, that all things are for the present quiet there, and that the Merchants of the Oriental Company have made an exchange of a great part of their goods at *Greek Weissenberg* and have sent away the remainder of them for *Constantinople*.

Legorn, Sept. 16. A Barque arriving here in seven daies from *Tunis* informs us, that they were there employing all the Vessels they could procure, lading them with Corn, Oyl, Honey, Butter, and all sorts of provisions for the relief of the Grand Vissiers Army before *Candix*, which were to be Convoied by nine of their Men of War, and might be ready to sail by the end of this month.

There has happened lately a difference between those of *Tunis* and *Algier*, about a rich prize, belonging to the latter, taken some time since by a Corsair of this piece, but afterwards retaken by another of *Tunis*: The goods belonging to Muselmens are by the Law adjudged to those of *Algier*, to whom they are in right to be restored, but the others being in possession of the whole, refuse to return above one half, which the *Algerines* resenting, were resolved to recover by the Law of Arms, if they are not suddenly complied with.

Even now is arrived a French Barque in six daies from *Algier*, which left *Monsieur Paul* two daies since with six Men of War returning for *Thoulon*, having been lately at *Algier* to confirm the Peace made between France and that place, telling us also, that the Corsairs had lately brought in there five *Hamburger*, taken by them in their way from *Lisbonne*, bound for *Amsterdam*, laden with Sigars, Oyls, and such kind of Merchandise, with a light *Genouete*, called the *Madonna del Rosario*, and one Spanish Barque, a Privateer, armed out against the French.

Dantzick, Sept. 17. Letters of the 9th Instant from *Poland* inform us, that the news of the taking of *Czebrin* by the *Cossicks* and *Tartars*, proves only a rumor without foundation: It has been notwithstanding closely besieged by them, but by the valour and Conduct of the Governor *Zimbrowski* stoutly defended, and the enemy beaten off in fourteen Assaults made by them upon the Town, wherein great numbers of them were killed and wounded; and has since sent out a strong party, which returned safely again into the Town with Cattle and Provisions, with which timely relief they will be enabled to hold out till the Succours can arrive, which are suddenly expected.

The Deputies appointed by the late Parliament to treat with the Officers of the Army at *Lemberg* about the payment of their Arrears, have now near ended that Affair, to the satisfaction of all parties: The Army being willing to accept of a sum of money in part of payment, and a quantity of Cloth that is to be assigned to them for the remainder; which done, the General will hasten away to his Command, the Army being ordered to lye about *Kamienitz* to attend the motion of the *Tartars* and *Cossicks*, though 'tis reported the former are returned back for fear of the *Muscovites*, and the latter seem already tyred with carrying the *Turkish* Yoke.

His Majesty of *Poland* is gone for *Crakaw*, to attend at the Obsequies of his Deceased Queen.

Hamburg, Sept. 19. Their Majesties of *Denmark*, with their Royal Highnesses, and the two Princesses Royal, the Electoral Prince and Princess of *Saxony*, with some other Princes are still at *Gluckstadt*, where the Duke of *Holslein*, and 'tis said also his Electoral Highness of *Brandenburg* is also expected.

Hamburg, Sept. 23. The Conference at *Craislaz* in *Brunswick* is ended, whose result was principally to take care for the repose and quiet of their own Countries, and as little as might be to interest themselves in the dissensions and disputes between the two Crowns.

The Deputies from their Highnesses the Electors of *Meyence* and *Treves*, and several other the Neighbouring Princes, are now met at *Cologne*, where is also present the Bishop of *Strasbourg*.

The 17th Instant all the Deputies of the Circle of *Westphalia* were to have their first Meeting, whither was also sent an Envoy from *Cassel* with his Credential Letters. 'Tis also reported, that the Bishop of *Munster* intends to be also there in person.
