THE Lord President acquainted the Board, that it was the pleasure of His Majesty that their Lordships should consider of the steps proper to be taken for causing a Form of Prayer to be put up to Almighty God, for the recovery of His Majesty from the severe indisposition under which His Majesty is labouring.

It is ordered by their Lordships, that letters be written to the Archbishop of Canterbury and the Archbishop of York, informing them of His Majesty's pleasure to that effect.

DISPATCHES, dated the 3d of April 1837, have been received by Viscount Palmerston, G. C. B. His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, from Richard Pakenham, Esq. His Majesty's Minister Plenipotentiary at Mexico, of which the following are an extract and a copy:

by the Mexican Government, provision is made for the fulfilment of the stipulations contained in the 5th article of the treaty with Great Britain, by placing foreign vessels upon the same footing as Mexican vessels in respect to the payment of tonnage

By the 2d article of this tariff it is provided, that " every foreign vessel arriving in the ports of the Republic shall pay twelve ryals for each ton, to which duty even national vessels shall remain subject, without any abatement whatever, when they come directly from a foreign port. The anchorage duty continues abolished for one and the other."

I have to add that, by a law, passed on the 8th of last month, it is declared, that the abatement of duty now granted on goods imported in national vessels shall cease within four months, counted from the date of the law: provision being thus made for the fulfilment of the stipulations contained in the 6th article of the treaty, which will come into effect on the 19th July next, and by which it is agreed that the same duties shall be paid on the importation into the territories of Mexico of any article, the growth, produce, or manufacture of His Majesty's dominions, whether such importation shall be in Mexican or British vessels.

My Lord, Mexico, April 3, 1837. BY a decree published in Mexico, on the 7th of IN the new tariff of duties, lately promulgated, last month, it is enacted that the ports which shall

henceforth continue open for foreign trade, are the following:

In the Gulph of Mexico-Vera Cruz, Santa de Tamaulipas (Tampico), Matamoros, Campeache, Sisal, and Tabasco.

In the Pacifick-Acapulco and San Blas. In the Gulph of California-Guaymas. In the Sea of Upper California-Monterey.

The following ports, hitherto open for foreign trade, are by the same decree declared to be closed except for the coasting trade:

Bacalar, Goatzacoalcos, Alvarado, Matagorda, Galveston, Huatulco, Manzanillo, Natividad, Mazat-Ian, La Paz, Loreto, San Diego, and Francisco.

But the measure is not to take effect until after six months, counted from the date of the publication of the decree.

HEREAS by an Act, made and passed in the Parliament holden in the third and fourth years of the reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for granting duties of Customs," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, by His Order in Council, from time to time, to order and direct, that there shall be levied and collected, any additional duty, not exceeding one fifth of the amount of any existing duty, upon all or any goods, wares, or merchandize, the growth, produce, or manufacture of any country, which shall levy higher or other duties upon any article the growth, produce, or manufacture of any of His Majesty's dominions, than upon the like article the growth, produce, or manufacture of any other foreign country; and, in like manner, to impose such additional duties upon all or any goods when imported in the-ships of any country which shall levy higher or other duties upon any goods when imported in British ships than when imported in the national ships of such country:

And whereas by a decree of Her Majesty the Queen of Portugal, dated the tenth day of January last, higher duties are levied in the ports of Portugal on goods, when imported in British ships, than when imported in Portuguese ships, His Majesty doth, therefore, under the authority of the above recited Act, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, order, and it is hereby ordered accordingly, that upon all goods imported into the United Kingdom in Portuguese ships, from and after the 20th Foot, Major Charles Cyril Taylor to be Lieu-

date of this Order, there shall be levied and collected, in addition to the existing duties otherwise payable upon the importation of such goods, a further duty, amounting to one fifth part of such existing
