**A** DISPATCH has been received at this Office from Sir Robert Ker Porter, Knt. His Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Caracas, dated the 3d of April 1837, transmitting a decree of the Government of Venezuela, respecting the establishment of commercial intercourse between that Republic and Spain, of which the following is a translation:

(Translation.)

*Commerce with Spain.*

The Senate and Chamber of Representatives of the Republic of Venezuela united in Congress.

DEGREE.

Art. 1. The Republic of Venezuela admits into its ports the merchant vessels of the Spanish nation, and offers to the subjects of Spain the same protection and guarantees as are enjoyed by other nations.

Art. 2. The decree of the 29th of April 1832, upon commerce with Spain, is abrogated.
