

hat, and sword knot; nor with their dress uniforms, than black gloves; and black crape on the left arm, hat, and sword knot; nor that the Officers of the Royal Marines should wear any other mourning with their uniforms, than black crape on the left arm, hat, and sword knot; except on duty, when they are to wear also black gloves, and the sash covered with black, and a black

crape scarf over the right shoulder; and except at Court, when they are to wear black crape on the left arm, hat, and sword knot, and a black crape scarf over their right shoulder.

The drums of the Royal Marines are to be covered with black, and a black crape is to be hung from the pike of the divisional colour staff.
