

fication, as prescribed in the foregoing paragraph, shall be previously made.

Eleventh. The 93d, 94th, and 95th articles, relating to the penalties denounced against Custom-house officers, and other public functionaries, for aiding or concealing smuggling; and authorising the informers to be present at the examination of goods seized in consequence of their information.

Twelfth. All the articles of the 7th chapter, relative to the distribution of confiscations, except as to pecuniary and personal penalties, inasmuch as, until the 17th day of September inclusive, of this year, those imposed by the laws in force previously to the 11th of March last, shall continue in full effect.

Article 3. The remaining articles of the new tariff not expressly declared by this Decree to be in force from the time of its publication in the respective places, shall not commence taking effect until from the 18th day, inclusive, of September of this year, the general tariff of 16th November 1827, the law of 31st March 1831, and the other existing regulations remaining in the mean time in force and vigour, in all such matters as are not altered or modified by those articles of the new tariff as are enumerated in the present Decree.
