count of the taking of *Virovisza* by Count Lessie. *Vienna, August 6.* Yesterday their Imperial Majestics returned hither from Lintz; and some hours after received the News of the Death of the Arch-Duke Leopold, their Second Son, who dyed at Ens the fourth Instant, which has much afflicted this Court. Several Companies of new railed Men have within these few days paffed through this place in their march for Hungary; and we are told that three Imperial Regiments of Foot, that have their Quarters near the Lake of Confance are ordered to march this way. We have advice from *Croatia* that General Leflie ha-ving put a Garifon into *Virovitza*. (Upon the furrender of which the Enemy abandoned the Towns of Soppia, Flatina, and Werazin) he march. ed to Brezowitz, and that being come before it, the Turks capitulated and furrendred the place the 27th pall upon the fame conditions that were granted to Virovitza; and that Count Leflie was laying a Bridge over the Drave near Furannitz: The Letters add that a great many Christians who lived in those Quarters under the Turkish Dominion had prayed Count Leflie to receive them into the Emperors Protection, to whom they have Swore Fidelity. Our last Letters from the Imperial Camp told us, that all things were preparing for a General Alfault ; However it is thought the Duke of Lorrain, seeing there are 8000 Janifaries in the place, and that the Imperial Army is not very firong in Foot, will not hazard an Alfault, which may colt him a great many Men; and the rather for that the Befieged have no expectation of Relief. a d that the want they are in of Provisions and Water will in a fhort time oblige them to Capitulate. Ratubonne, Aug. 11. The fourth Inftant the Sicur May, one of the Imperial Commissioners, acquainted the Count de Crecy, that the Emperor had received full Power from the King of Spain to accept and conclude in the Name of his Catholick Majelty the Truce of Twenty Years, upon the Conditiors proposed by the Most Christian King; and that the Imperial Commissioners had given notice thereof to the Dyet, to the end the King of Spain, his Countries and Dominions, may be included in the Treaty between the Emperor and the Crown of France, under the Guaranty of the Empire. The fixth, the Sieur May communicated to the Count de Creey the Original Power fent to the Emperor by the King of Spain, and his Imperial Majelies Sub Delegation to his Commidioners here, and left with him Copies of these Instruments; and at the fame time the Count de Crecy communicated to him the Power he had from his Molt Christian Majefty: The days following the Imperial Commissioners and the Count de Creey had several Conferences in the Gohvent of the Dominicans, and having concluded the Treaty of Truce between France and Spain, it was Signed laft night by the faid Count, and by the Im-perial Commiffioners in the Name of the King of Spdin. Cologne, Aug. 15. Several of the Regiments that were encamped at Zons are marched towards the River Erp, and it's believed the reft of the Army will follow in few days The States of the Circle of Suabia, who are now allembled at Ulm, have re-folved to 1 nd feveral Regiments to joyn the Empe-The States of the Circle ror's Army in Hungary.

Bruffels, Aug. 15. Monfieur de Chanlay arrived here last Tuejday in the evening, and the fame night had Audience of the Marquis de Grana; it's faid he came to adjust the Payment of the Contributions, and yesterday he parted again from hence: While he was here, his Excellency received an account by an Express from Ratinbonne, That the Truce between France and Spain was Signed there on Thursday last at night. We have advice that the Mareschal de Schomberg having passed the Meuse, is marched through Luxemburg towards Strasburgb, where he is to be the 20th Instant. The Marquis de Foyeufe continues with the Troops under his Command in the Country of Limburg. We are told that the Eleftor of Cologne's Forces march towards Liege; That his Electoral Highness has sent one of his Ministers to make fome Proposals to the Magistrates of that City; and that he has appointed the States of Liege to meet the 26th Inftant at Vifet, and that he will be himfelf prefent in their Affembly. The Siege of Buda proves a Work of longer time than was expected ; the Duke of Lorrain is, it's faid, refolved not to hazard his Men in forming of it, feeing the Place muft in a fhort time fall into his hands, having no expectation of Relief.

Hague, Aug. 18. Here passes little of moment in the absence of the States of Holland, who are not to re-affemble till the next month : But by an Exprefs from Ratubonne we have an account that the Treaty of Truce between France and Spain was Signed there the tenth Inflant, being the latt day of the fix weeks allowed by the Treaty Signed here the 29th of Fune; and that that between the Emperor and the Empire, and his Most Christian Majesty, was Mkewise concluded. They write from Amsterdam that the Directors of the East-India Company had advice of the arrival of nine of their Ships upon these Coalls, whereof four came from Batavia the 23. of December last, the rest from Ceylon and the Coaft.

Paris, Aug. 19. On Tuesday last arrived here an Express dispatched by the Count de Crecy, his Most Chriffian Majeflies Plenipotentiary at Ratisbonne, who brought an account that the Treaty for a Twenty Years Truce between this Crown and Spain was Signed there the tenth Inflant, with the Inclusion of the Republick of Genoua. It's not doubted the Truce with the Emperor and Empire will quickly follow. There are Letters from Lintz of the eighth Inflant, which fay they had the News there of the Surrender of Buda, which we hope our next will give us the confirmation of. There happened the last week about Poitiers a kind of a Hurricano, ac-

companied with Hail, which did a great deal of harm, some of the Hailstones are faid to have been bigger than Hen-Eggs, and the reft as big as large Nuts. Our Letters from Catalonia inform us, that the 18th of the laft month the French Flect commanded by Monfieur du Quefne, failed out of the Bay of Rofes, and took their courie towards Barcelona; and that the fame day the Marcfchal de Belfunds parted from his Camp near Rofes, to put his Troops into Quarters of Refreihment upon the Hills, during the great Heats; in his March three or four hundred Miquelets came and skirmished with his Rear-Guard, but leveral of them were killed, and the reft quickly forced to retire : The Town of Campredon fent to make their fubmiffion to the Marefchal de Belfonds, the Spanish Garifon that was there having retired into the Caffle. Seven Squadrons detached from the Spanish Army, which was en-camped on a Hill about a mile from *Campredon* fhewed themfelves near that place, but they foon after retired again : When thele Letters came away, the Marcichal de Belfonds was encamped at Esquieres de Rougea in l'Ampourdan.
