Leasowe Light.—This light will be so masked as to give a defined light in the Rock Channel, within certain limits, and will suddenly disappear, bearing S. W. to vessels inward bound, when our West Wharf Buoy, R. 3, red, and suddenly appear, when outward bound.

Bidston Light.—This light will also be masked, so as to give a defined light in the Rock Channel, within certain limits, and to vessels inward bound will suddenly disappear on the bearing off S.S. W. when abreast of East Wharf Buoy, R. 4, red, and suddenly appear when outward bound.

These lines of masking and unmasking intersect that spot in the Crosby Channel, where the course alters, so that, in running up from the Formby Floating Light, the mariner must haul up from S. S. E. \(\frac{1}{4}\) E. to S. by E. \(\frac{1}{4}\) E., on losing Bidston and Leasowe Lights, and, on running down, keep away from N. by W. \(\frac{1}{4}\) W. to N. N. W. \(\frac{1}{4}\) W., on their opening out.
